On Saturday the AAA squa visited Chinguacousy for a close fought struggle, decided in the dying seconds with an Aaron Cowey goal


from just outside the crease, assisted by Ley and Scott Enair.


This one was a defensive struggle with no room given for maneuvering by either team. Final score 1-0. Ryan McManus played well to earn the shutout, his second in

took place against Sunday against Guelph, a 5-2 win for the Hurricanes.


