

CVCA elects new executive

The Credit Valley Conservation Authority (CVCA) elected Mississauga councillor Harold Kennedy as its 1994 chairman in an uncontested vote at their authority meeting Thursday night.

Paul Dray of Erin was elected vice chairman.

Six members were also chosen for the 1994 executive committee. They remain, Fred Wilson of Orangeville, Frank Dale of Mississauga, John Hutton of Brampton, Andy King of Erin Township, Susan Fennell of Brampton and Dick Pallett of Caledon.

"I'm honored to served as CVCA chairman for 1994 and look forward to the challenge ahead," said Kennedy. "The importance of getting back to our grassroots in 1994 can't be over stated."

The 1994 preliminary budget estimates were also released with a projected 0.85 per cent decrease in levy over last year.

"In these times of fiscal restraints we are trying hard to set an example by holding the line on our spending even though our work load is increasing," says CVCA acting general manager Ken Owen.

"Unfortunately the Preliminary

Budget is based on unknown approvals for capital projects and does not deal with further rumored cuts at the provincial level. However we are pleased to announce that we are committed to reaching our budget targets without increasing any of our fees in 1994."

The CVCA has accomplished a zero increase by eliminating some programs, reducing its permanent and temporary work force, reducing benefits to employees and freezing wages as part of the provincial Social Contract.

A more detailed budget will be brought forward in February.
