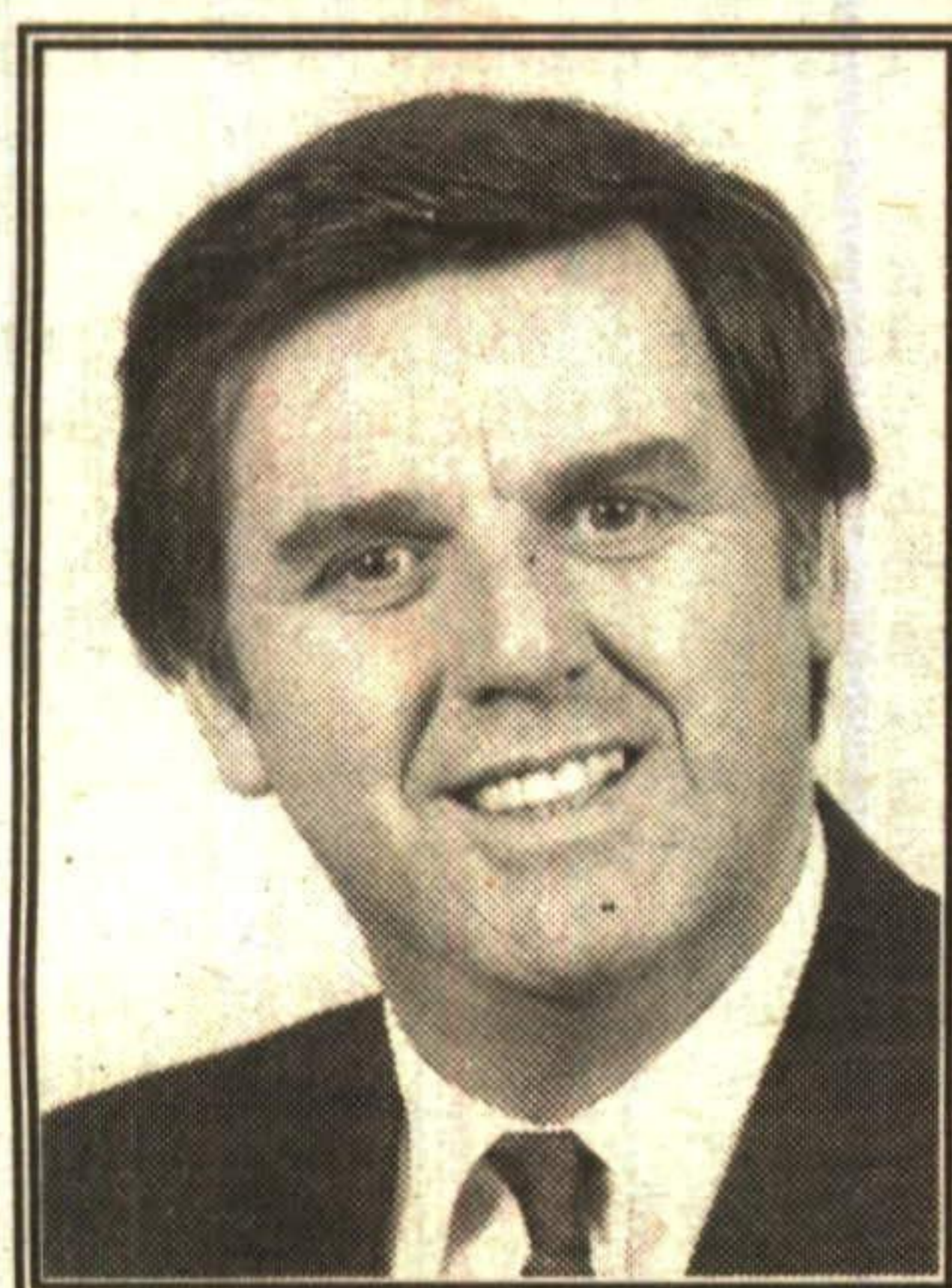

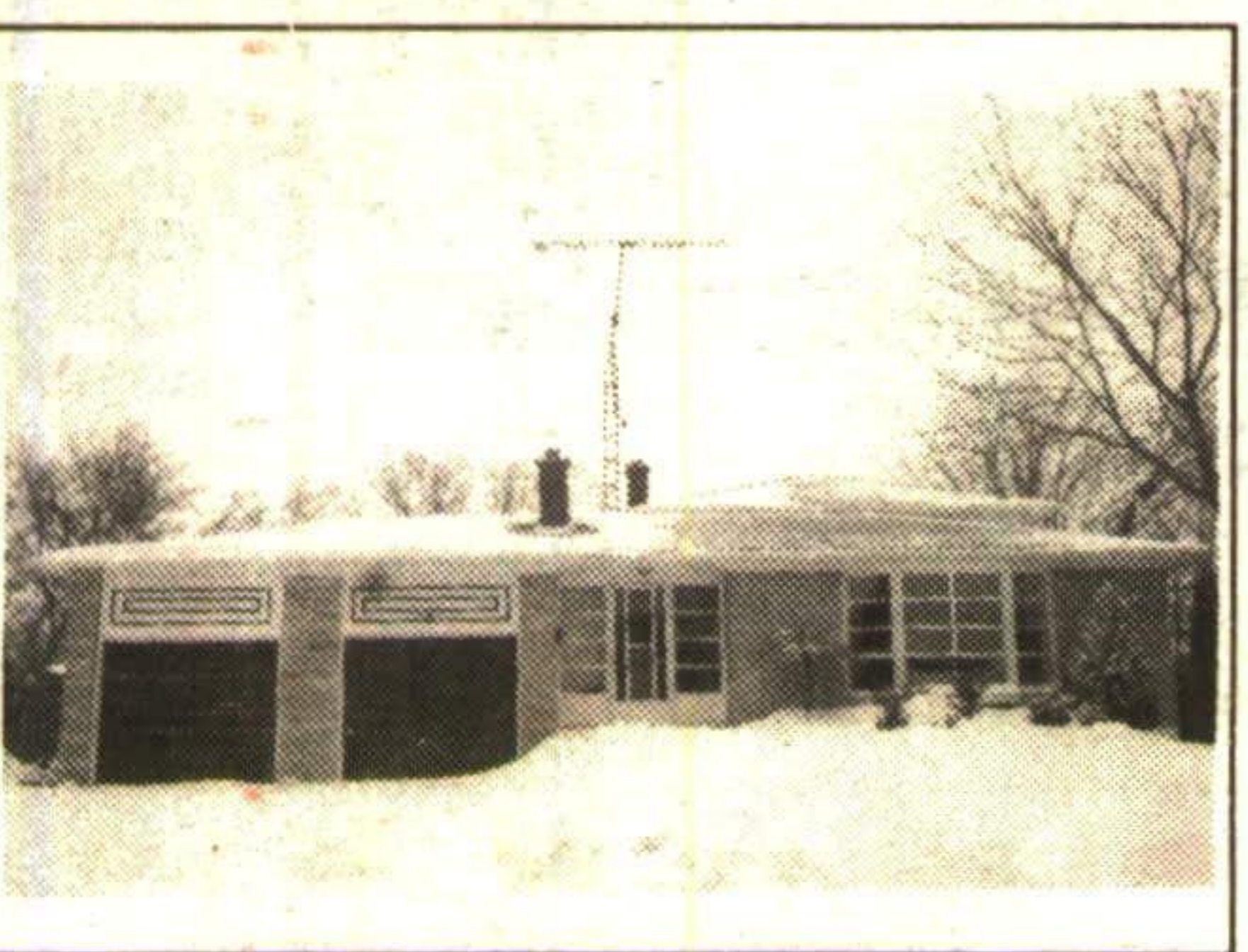

# Quick action saves man's life

Ed Hillier figures he was in the right place at the right time.

The volunteer firefighter who works for the town picking up garbage was on his regular route on Elmore Dr. in Acton on Wednesday, Feb. 6 when his nose told him something was wrong.

"I smelled it first. When you've been in the fire department for ten or 11 years, you get to know the difference between the smell of a wood fire and a house fire," Hillier said.

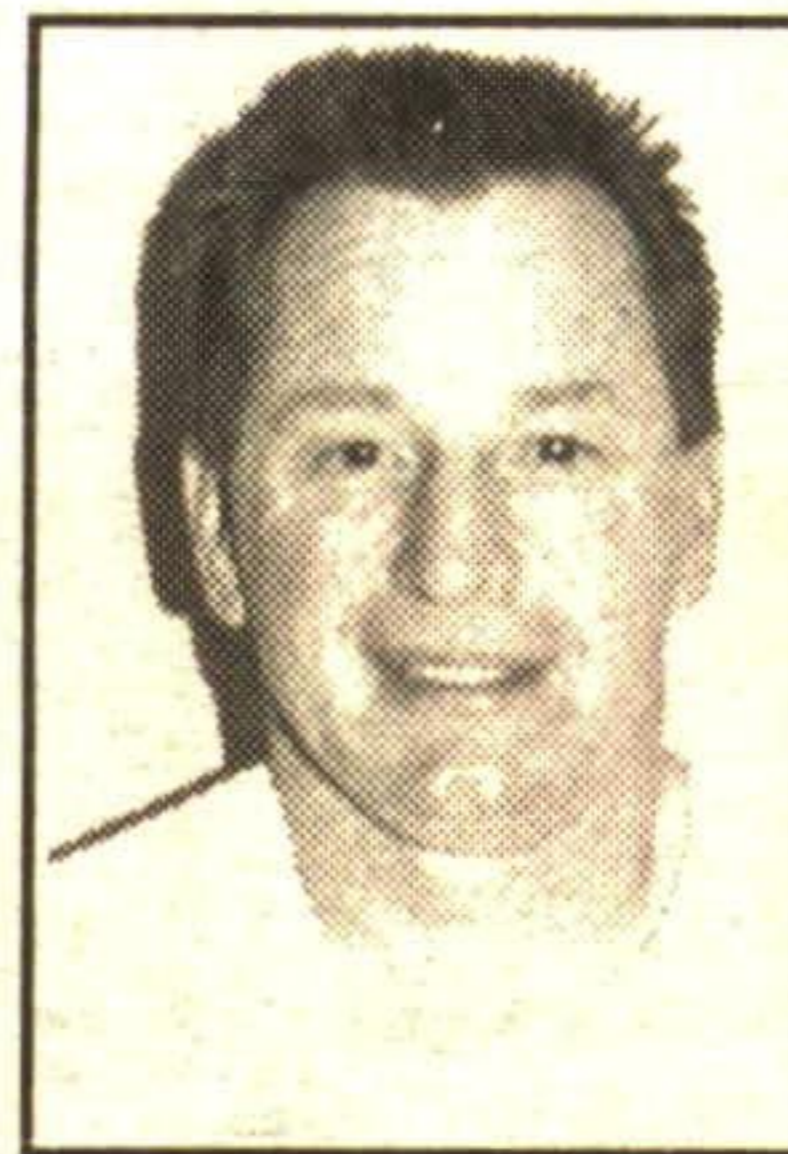
He stopped the truck and walked in a couple of different directions before he saw smoke coming out of two roof vents in a house at 76 Elmore Dr. Hillier walked up to the house and noticed that a door was ajar. He told a neighbor, who was just coming home, to call the fire department.

"I walked up to the door and yelled out, but no one answered," he said. "I knew there was someone in there because the door was open and no cars were around and there were no footprints in the early morning fall of snow."

He began to walk through the house and could see through the smoke, because there was enough sunlight,

he said. But when Hillier got to the kitchen, there was no more smoke, only flames everywhere.

"I saw a man standing, holding onto a telephone. I yelled to get out, but he just stood shaking, like he was having a seizure. Things were falling down around his head," Hillier said. The man didn't move, so Hillier grabbed him and took him out of the house, across the street to the home of the neighbor who had called the fire department.

"I've got no bones about it. I was scared. I was standing there in the doorway and I had no equipment on," he said. "After I was shaking, I was glad to get out of there."

While Hillier has had search and rescue training and knew what to do, he said it is very different to go into a house without any breathing apparatus or protective gear.

Peter Papillon, the resident of the house, is in his 80s and had left some bacon on the stove. He was treated at Georgetown Hospital for burns to his head, and then released. He is staying with his sister Mary, who said he is fine and she doesn't know when repairs on his house will be complete.

The Halton Hills Fire Department said the house was fully involved by the time they arrived. They estimate there was about \$75,000 damage to the house.
