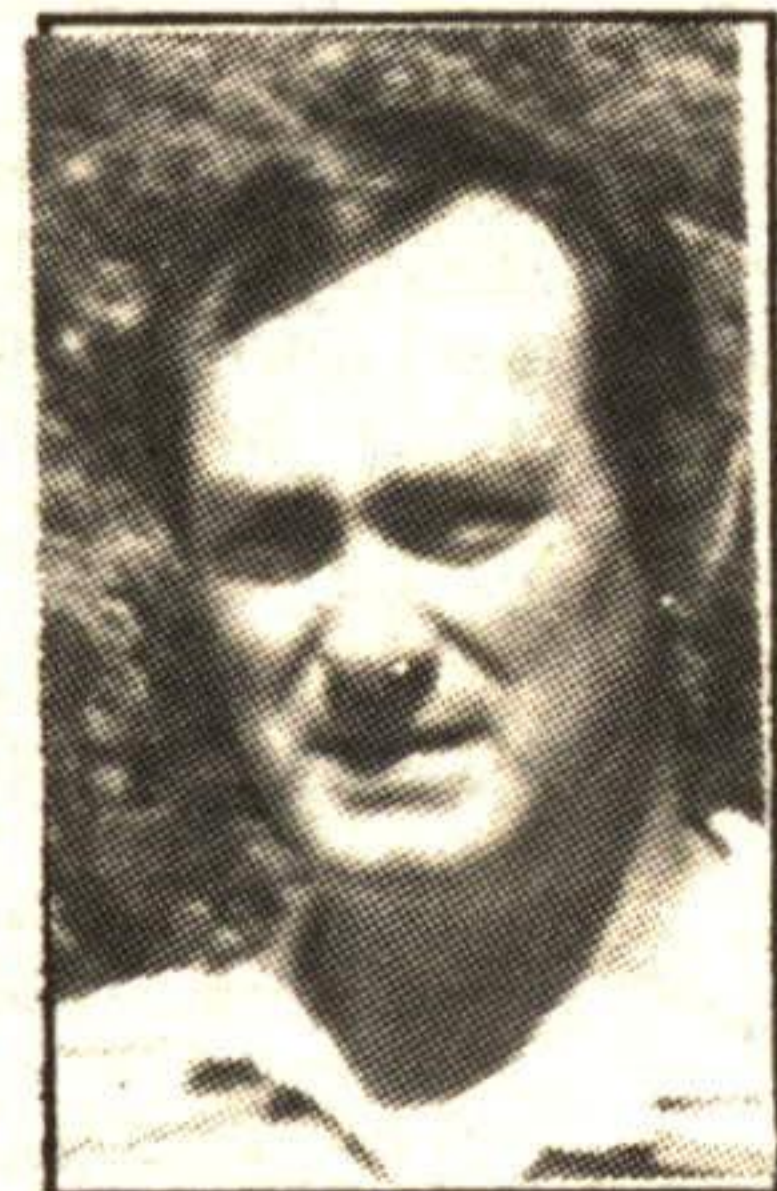
Recipients will receive a certificate and a \$1,000 grant to cover expenses for professional development.

WARD 2 / ESQUESING

Council for the Town of Halton Hills will conduct a Public Meeting to examine and discuss a proposal to amend the Town's Official Plan and amend Zoning By-law 74-51 for a Plan of Subdivision. The Official Plan Amendment would incorporate the subject lands into an expanded Highway 7/Fourth Line Rural Cluster Area. The residential subdivision would include twenty-five (25) lots, a highway commercial block and retention of the existing dwelling as a separate block.

The lands affected by the proposed amendments are setback from the southwest corner of Highway 7 and Fourth Line on a 38.5 hectare (95 acre) holding.
