Beards approved for Halton police

Thanks to a decision by the Halton Police Services Board, any Halton police officer who wishes to grow a beard may do so without reprisal from his superiors.

Even the clean-shaven Halton Police Chief Peter Campbell, said he'd welcome bearded officers. "I have no problem with it," he said. The new standing orders to all police units will include a picture of the ideal police beard so that officers and their superiors have some guidelines.

The new rules will also direct officers to grow their beards while on vacation to avoid the grubbylooking 'growing out' period.

Campbell said the issue came up after several members of the Halton Police requested permission to grow beards because other police forces in Ontario, including the Ontario Provincial Police, have permitted beards for the past six months.

"We're asking that they wear a neat and well-trimmed beard," said Campbell.

"There will be a subjective element here. The length and style of beard will be up to the supervisor's discretion," added the chief.

Board member Fred Oliver opposed the idea of police supporting beards. At the Feb. 24th meeting, Oliver voted against the

amendment to the forces' regulations of appearance and dress. But Oliver, an Oakville councillor and former police chief of Oakville when the town had its own force, wears a beard.

"I never said it had anything to do with the way a police officer performs his job," said Oliver.

"It's my personal opinion. I think it's a matter of what is neat and what isn't," said Oliver. "I don't think police officers should wear beards while in uniform".

Oliver said that while he now sports a beard, he grew it after retiring from his police duties.

Paul La Course, administrator

for the Halton Police Association, said he welcomes beards as "a positive step." "The police services traditional-

ly have been a para-military environment. It's nice to see them vary from that," said La Course.

La Course said the beards are cosmetic and should not detract in any way from an officer's effective-

"It's a minor issue," said La Course. "It's not going to have a negative impact on the officers' job performance."

Only a few officers are likely to take advantage of the new rules, said La Course.

"The main issue for critics should be with police officers doing their jobs and not with their appearance," said La Course.
