

# Gymnast strikes gold

The weekend of January 30 marked the Central Ontario 2nd Qualifying Competition in Oakville, Ontario.

Gymnasts from over 20 Clubs competed for top region honours and gymnasts from our very own local clubs turned in exceptional performances.

Each season there are three qualifying competitions within each region of Ontario. The best two competitions are counted and the top six gymnasts out of two meets are selected to represent Central Region at the Provincial Championships to be held in May.

The 2nd Qualifier marked several personal best performances from gymnasts of the Halton Hills Gymnastics Club.

In the Novice 2 division, 12 yr old Jennifer Robertson brought home the All Around Gold Medal, along with first place finishes in the vault, balance beam and floor and a fourth on bars. Ashley Johnson was the Silver All Round medalist, placing 4th on vault, 2nd on bars and beam and 3rd on floor. In the same category, Katie McCormick turned in a Silver medal performance on

the floor and placed 11th overall. Danielle Ellis placed 4th on the Floor with a beautiful routine and Daniela Soria with a few tough breaks also competed in this category.

This novice two team were also the All Around team champions for their respective division.

In the pre-novice two division, nine year old Brooke Azeltner placed fifth on vault and ninth all round.

13 year old Julie Brown had the meet wrapped up until her last event, where she had a few tough breaks on the beam. In the Junior 1 Category, she placed 4th on vault, 3rd on bars and 5th on floor.

In the Senior 1 category, Jennifer Stocks placed fifth on vault, bars and beam and 7th overall.

Also competing for Halton Hills, Miss Erica Mrowietz and Miss Jolene DeOliviera.

The Central Ontario Third Regional Qualifier will be held March 25 to 27 in St. Catharines.

It is at this qualifier that the central teams going to Provincials are selected.

The weekend of February 19 and 20 saw West Side's tenacious play continue to carry through when they won the prestigious Omnium Du Quebec/Quebec Juvenile Open in an exciting 2-0 win over Celtique in Montreal.

"We learned a big lesson at Penn State," observed David Sands, "in that we had to remain focussed and play every point as a new point and this renewed focus has allowed our team to finish its matches more successfully. This is something we will have to keep in mind when we play in the Juvenile Ontario Open in Bowmanville." This competition involved 15 teams from Ontario, Quebec and Western New York.

Asked about the team's training program, coach John Burt of Oakville said, "About a month ago one of the university coaches shared a quote attributed a Will Rogers that says even if you are on the right track, you will get run over if you just sit there! This is certainly true with regard to this team in both temperament and training. We need to continually change and adapt new training strategies in order to stay ahead of our competition."

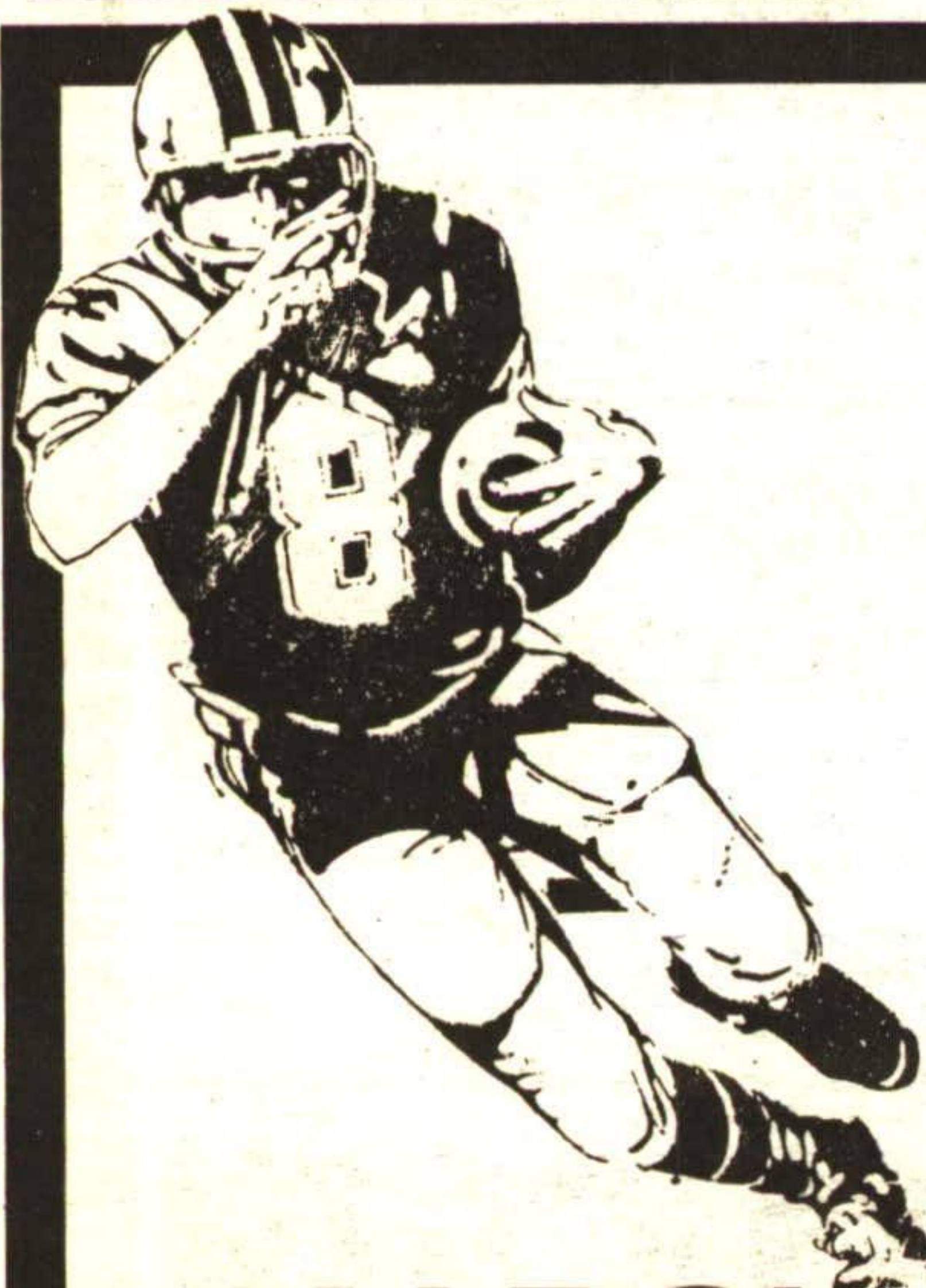
