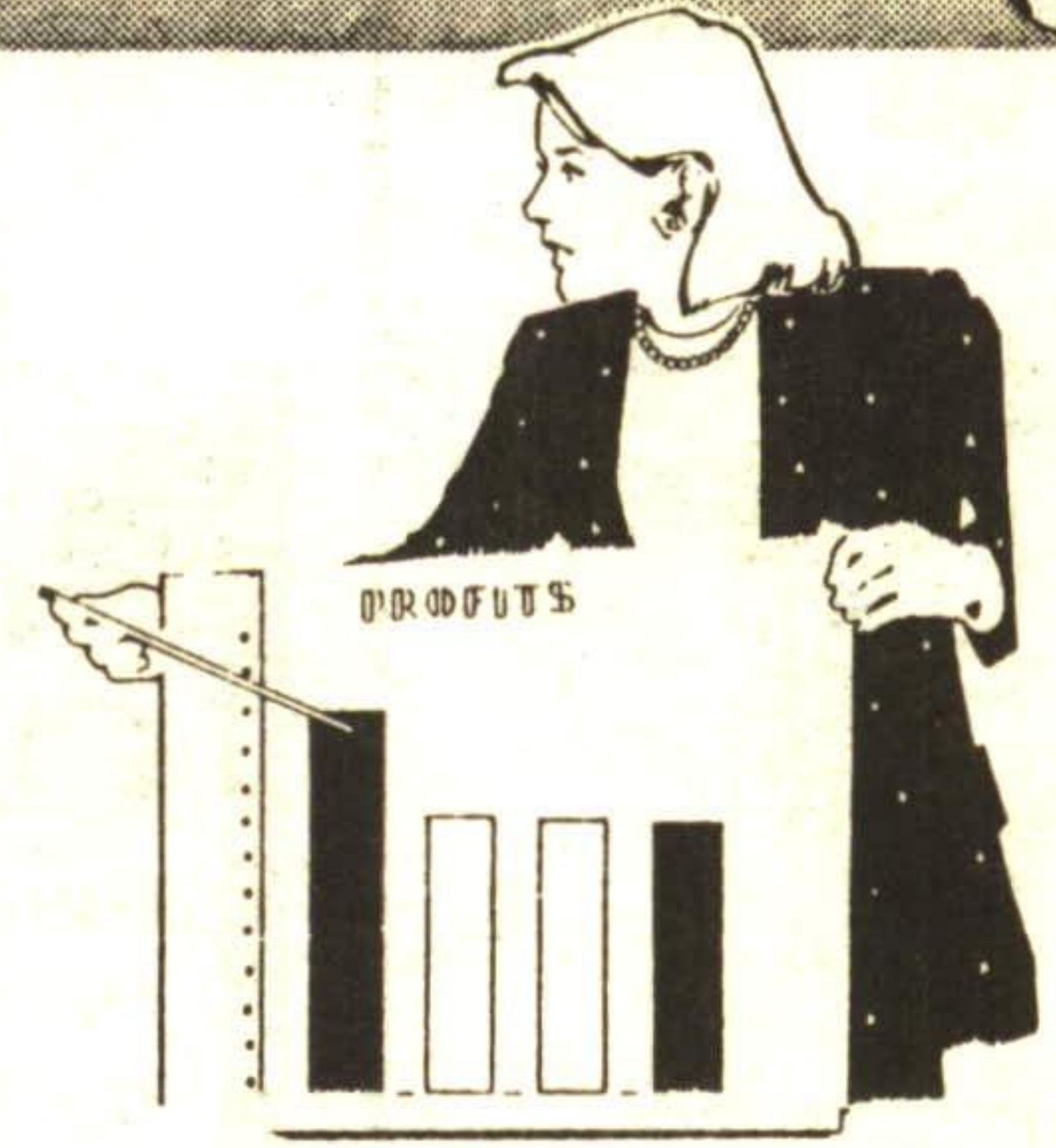




WOMEN IN BUSINESS
