Rebels swim to impressive fifth at OFFSAA championships

Georgetown District High School swimmers finished off an outstanding 1993/94 season last weekend with an impressive fifth place team showing at the All-Ontario OFSAA finals in Sudbury.

The three-day meet included participants from over 140 schools across the province. For the GDHS Rebels, the meet featured a bronze medal (third) performance for the boys and an eighth place finish for the girls.

"It was just a great team performance for Georgetown, and a great season," said Rebels' swim coach Debbie Knoepfli.

After a big Halton finals performance which included three gold medals, senior boys' swimmer Glen Oomen led the way for Georgetown again at OFSAA with two golds including one in the 50 metre

freestyle - which he swam in 24.19 seconds to set the only new OFSAA record for 1994.

Oomen, Kevin Taylor, Matt Deruchie and Robert Weston took first in the 200m freestyle relay, finishing in 1:41.28 minutes.

Weston also claimed gold with his 27.79 second finish in the 50m butterfly. He also took 9th in the 100m intermediate medley. Taking silver in the 200m freestyle was Taylor, who also finished in the top 10 in the 50m freestyle.

Heading up the girls team was Sabrina Bassett who captured silver in the senior girls' 200m freestyle with a time of 2:23.52 and in the senior girls' 100m freestyle with a time of 1:04.50.

Andrea Herner finished sixth in the senior girls' 100m backstroke.

Kristen Herner, Micah Zarnke and Leigh Shillington all placed in the top 15 in their individual events

while also competing in individual races were Andrea Herner, Melissa Discenza and Justine Colton.

The junior boys' relay team (Andrew Gibson, Jason Morden, Fraser Charles and Steve Masters) finished 10th in the 200m freestyle and 14th in the 200m medley while the junior girls' squad (Tracy Tabuchi, Jenny Grant, Lisa Mathiasen and Melissa Discenza) took 12th place in the 200m freestyle and 14th in the 200m medley.

In other relay action, the senior girls (Sabrina Bassett, Justine Colton, Kristen Herner and Leigh Shillington) finished 14th in the 200m medley while the senior boys (Trevor Charles, Micah Zarnke, Dave Sands and Matt Deruchie) also placed 14th in the 200m medley.

The senior girls' team of Karen Mathiasen, Jen Apgar, Jenny Grant and Andrea Herner took 32nd place in the 200m freestyle.

The Major Novice Raider squad traveled to Oakville March 9, claiming a win.


Oakville took a 1-0 first frame
