

# Midget Rebels claim third straight volleyball crown

For a third straight season, the Georgetown District High School Rebels established themselves as the best midget girls' volleyball team in Halton Region.

After an unbelievable undefeated regular season, which included 36 straight wins, the midget girls capped off their championship year

by winning the North Halton crown on home court - and then taking the Halton Regional title at M.M. Robinson High School in Burlington.

In the Halton final match-up, the local squad took a 2-1 decision over the Notre Dame Fighting Irish.

The Rebels won game one 15-2 and they took a 15-13 loss in the next game (their only one of the season) they stormed back for another 15-2 victory to bring the

title back home.

The Rebels beat E.C. Drury in the semi-finals and took down Milton District in quarter-final action. In their pool play, they posted 2-0 victories over the Blakelock, Lester B. Pearson, Assumption and Acton.

"I was very proud of the girls this season. They played consistent and worked well together as a team. The team was pretty balanced this year and everyone made big improvements in their game," said head coach Russ Linney.

In the North Halton tournament

at GDHS, the Rebels beat Acton, Milton District, E.C. Drury and Bishop Reding on route to capturing the crown. Georgetown finished up their 1993-94 campaign with an outstanding 61-1 record - which included both league play and tournament action.

## Bracky's claim title



The Halton League closed down league play for the season with an anti-climax. Bracky's Boys clinched first place with their win at Time Out Two whilst Legion Three lost to McGibbon.

The winning margin turned out to be 17 points and the league has a new name to put on the championship. At the same time there is a new name for the play off title, with McGibbon as the winners, Legion Three runners up and Bracky's in third place.

Legion Three's final assault was hindered somewhat by only fielding five players against McGibbon. This meant a void game and four losses by the "dummy" player. However, some good scoring was recorded. Paul Kirby hit four 140s, Chris Scutt hit three and 139. Dave Nicholls hit two 140s, 125 and 121. As a result of the point spread McGibbon held on to third place, an achievement for a mixed team. The ladies played a full part in wins and scores.

Legion Four fell to Copper Kettle, their charge faltering in the last two weeks, and they are fourth and Kettle tenth in the standings. Charley's One and Two met with #1 coming out on top and are fifth, #2 finish in eleventh spot. Royal Pizza closed with a flourish in winning over Time Out One to end with a sixth place and Time Outs are eight and ninth. Legion's One and Two concluded with #1 winning 12-2 over the last placed, almost all female team.

Erwin See and Steve Foster notched 180 each to lead the high scores for the week. Lots of 140s, including Paul Mousseau, Eric Fuller, Frank Desantis, Gord Kennedy and Todd Axford. Brad Youmans hit 142 and Ed Paterson scored 136, Mark See scored 137.

The season MVP is Paul Kirby who amassed 252 points, 148 of them in the bonus area. Pete Pickering finishes in second place with 191 and third place goes to Neil Olmstead with 166. Dave Scutt, Bruce Hope, Dave Nicholls, Al Murphy, Ian McDonald, Mike Pepper and Larry Hunt round out the top ten. None of the winning Brackys players are in that list, appearing a little down the stand-

ings. Leading the ladies is Darlene Wheeler, from 33rd place. Kim Smid is 41st and Diana Zawacki is 57th overall and are second and third ladies respectively.

Leading the 180 scorers is Ian McDonald with 6, Peter Pickering has 5 and Paul Kirby has 4. Russ Hillier and Brad Youmans each have three. The high finish belongs to Brian Ward with 155. He held on for a long time and Erwin See came close with 154. Jeff Henderson had the most closes, with 6; Neil Olmstead had five and Erwin See had four.

Now the league is into the trial playoffs for a few weeks to keep the bars busy and players in form. The success of the trial will depend on teams and players fulfilling the exhibition commitment through to the finish, around mid April. The team captains for next season will vote on the adoption of the system into the schedules at the August meeting (first Tuesday in August at the Legion).

Meanwhile the Industrial league continues with its schedule. Wednesday, 9th is singles night commencing 7 p.m., that is correct 7 p.m. Then it is return to league play for a few weeks before going down to playoffs.

Dream Team defeated Gasketman to stay ahead of the pack although Hustlers picked up a couple of points with their win over Independents. Westenders had a 'walk over' with Firemen and Steeprock took Bullsitters down by the maximum. Hotshots leapfrogged over Ensigns with their win over Aces, whilst Ensigns lost by one point to Panthers, who move to eighth spot. Acadian Pools fought off the Bandits to record an 8-1 win. Bandits are now six points adrift of the Firemen at the foot of the table.

Ensigns began well enough against Panthers, winning the first two legs, losing the third and winning the next two. The game unfolded after that and Panthers took four in succession for the win. Al Murphy opened with 80 and scored 100 with Marcus Noel scoring two tons and that was it for the match.

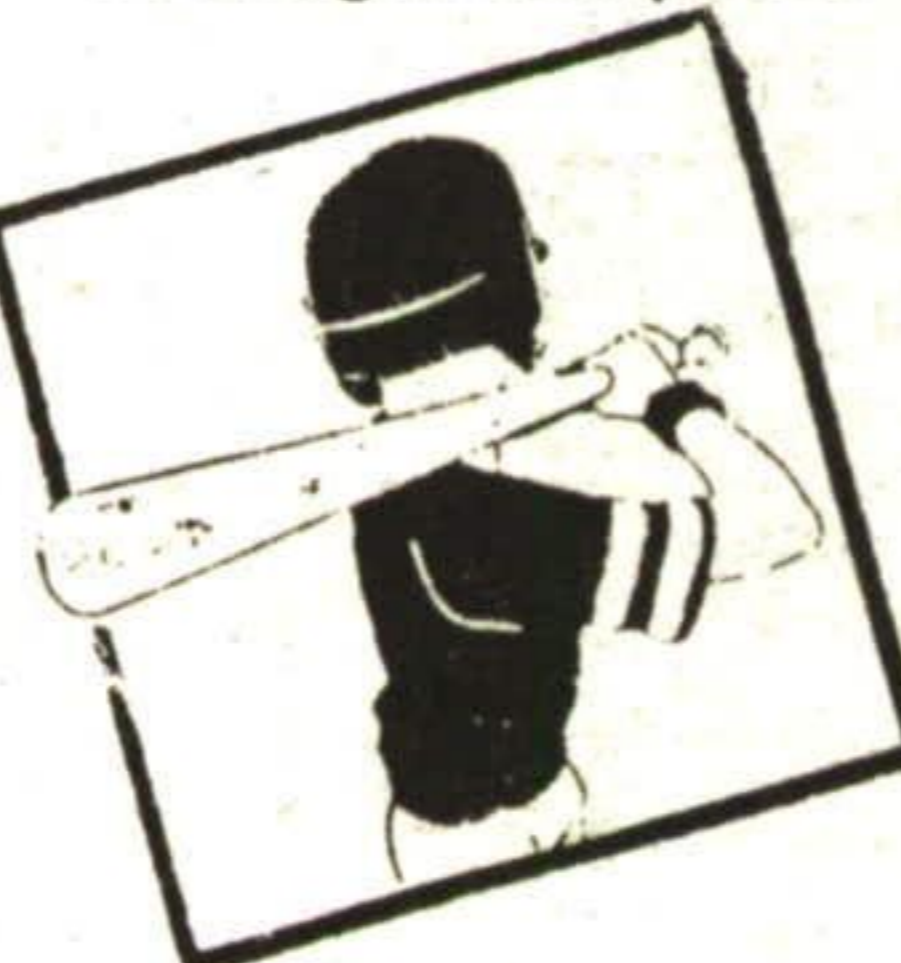
