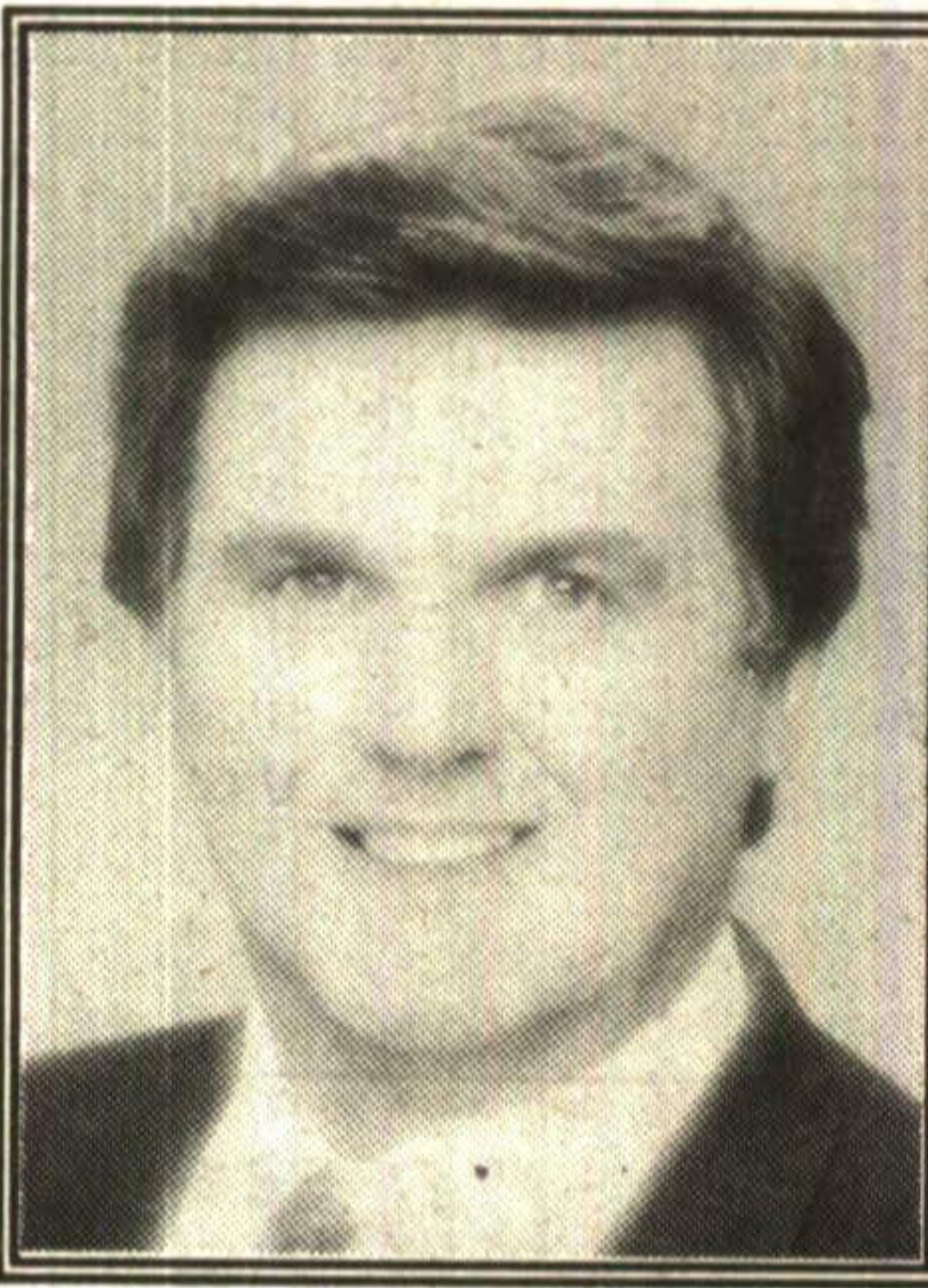

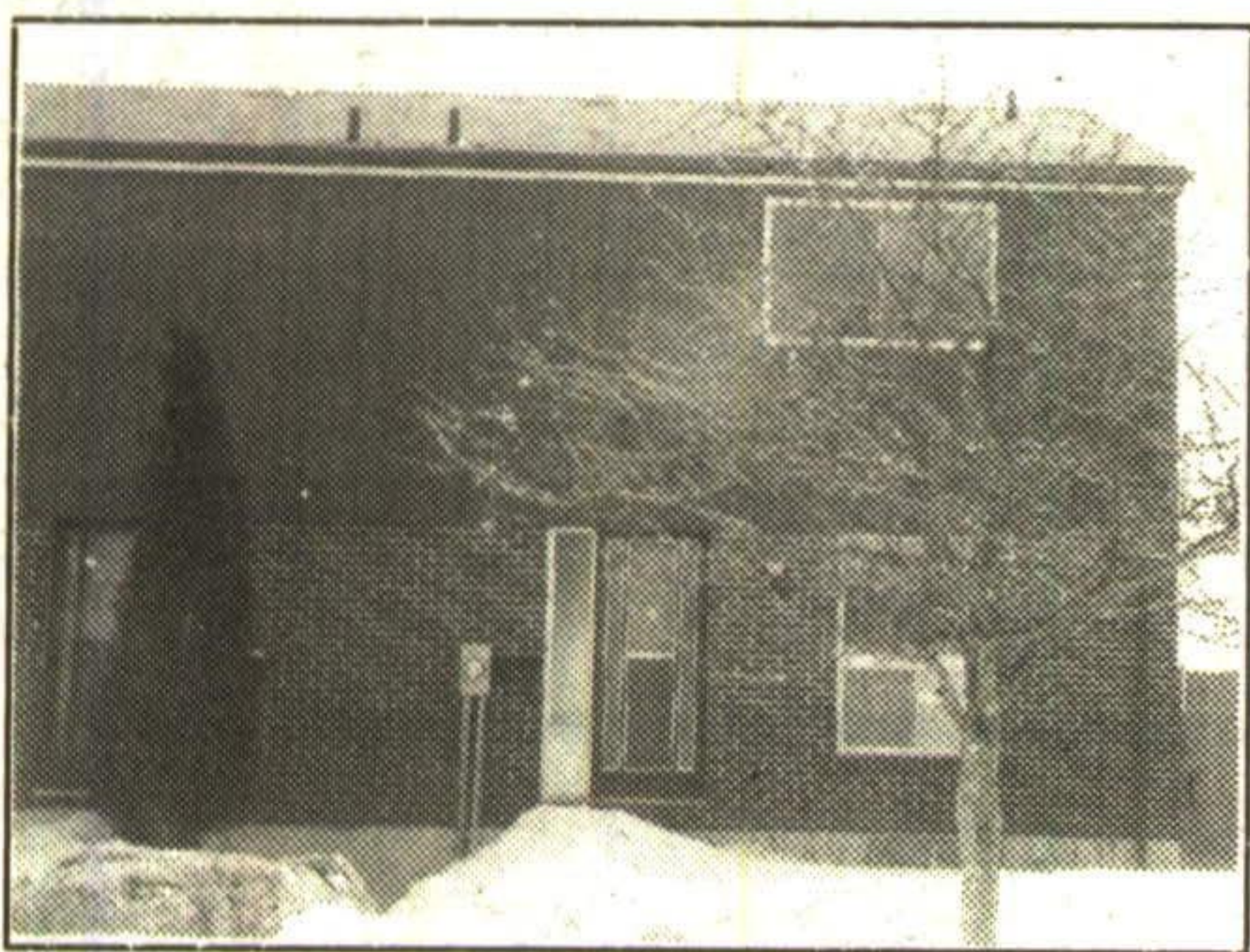

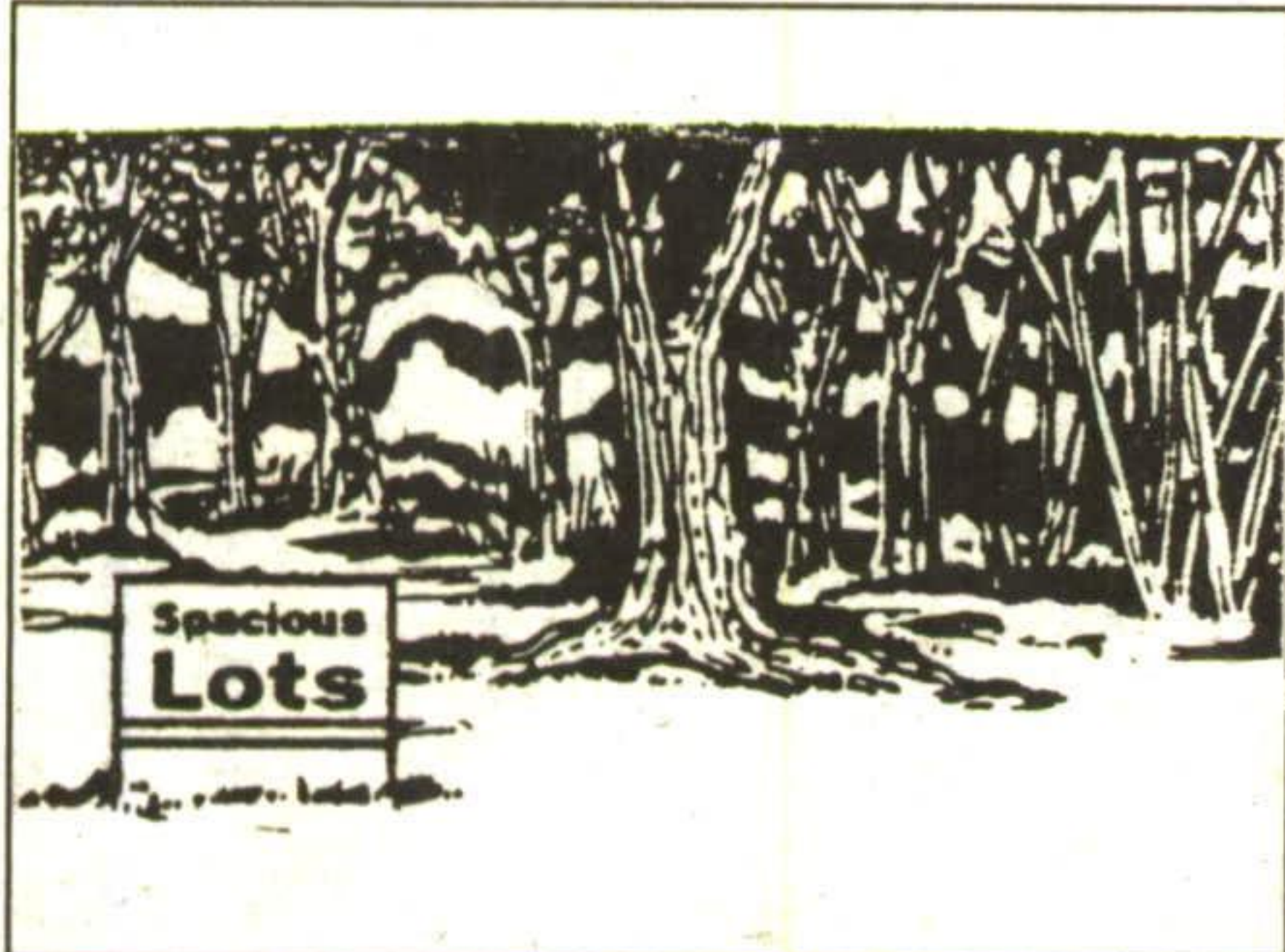

Former bank manager convicted

A former Georgetown bank manager was sentenced to six months in jail for sexually assaulting another bank employee.

Steven Philip Hay, 37, went to trial for two days in December. After six hours of deliberating, the jury found him guilty. He was sentenced by Justice Patrick LeSage in Milton Provincial Court March 10.

According to Detective Constable Dave Broughton, in July, 1992, Hay and an employee were touring some real estate properties when they stopped in at Hay's home. The woman testified that he kissed her, grabbed her breast, then forced her hand onto his groin, eventually exposing himself and rubbing against her. The woman said she

asked him to stop several times.

While Hay had a similar story, he said these actions were consensual, Det. Const. Broughton said. Hay dropped the victim off at work after the incident, and then went to get his car repaired. The first person the woman saw happened to be an employee who was her friend, and she told her what happened with Hay and was visibly upset. The victim ended up leaving work early and then called police for some advice before reporting the incident.

"I admire (the victim) for being able to come forward to speak up about what she went through," Det. Const. Broughton said.

She has now been transferred to another bank. Hay was eventually fired from his position.

Crime Stoppers

Builders of a new subdivision in Georgetown experienced the frustration of having their work become meaningless a couple of weeks ago.

New gas fireplaces were installed on January 12th in five homes being built on the future Hepburn Cres. (off Argyll, west of Mountainview Rd.). When construction staff returned to the houses at 6 a.m. on the 13th, they found the fireplaces had been stolen.

Homes on nearby Harrop Ave. and Lauchlin Cres. had entry doors and a garage door stolen the same night. Halton police estimate the stolen property to be worth more than \$6000.

House break-in

Someone went on a window smashing spree at Halton Hills Manufacturing in Acton. Overnight Sunday, 10 windows were smashed at the building, police said. Police have no suspects in the incident.

Four cars parked in an underground lot on Park Ave. in Georgetown were damaged and equipment was stolen overnight Sunday. Windows were smashed and doors were pried open. Stereos were stolen from two cars, speakers were taken from a third while nothing was taken from a fourth car, police said.
