"The three areas are already established, and their canvassers and captains (in charge of the canvassers) are mostly all in place," says Pat. "We only need someone to organize and coordinate the efforts in each area.

"I know people are busy, have jobs and lots of extra activities, but this community is so supportive, and we all need to give back from time to time."
