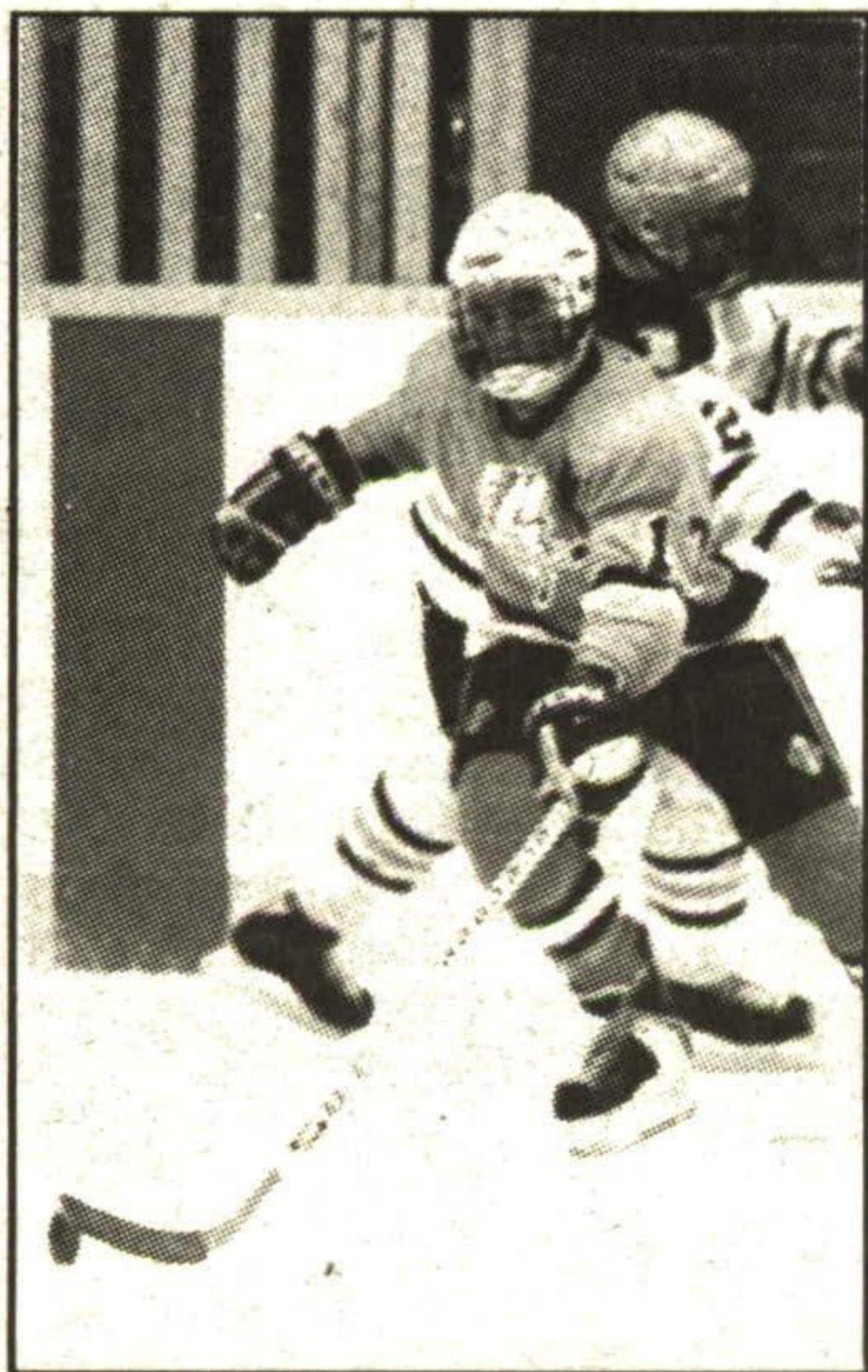
Semi-final action was held yesterday afternoon (Saturday) while the division finals will be held this morning (Sunday).

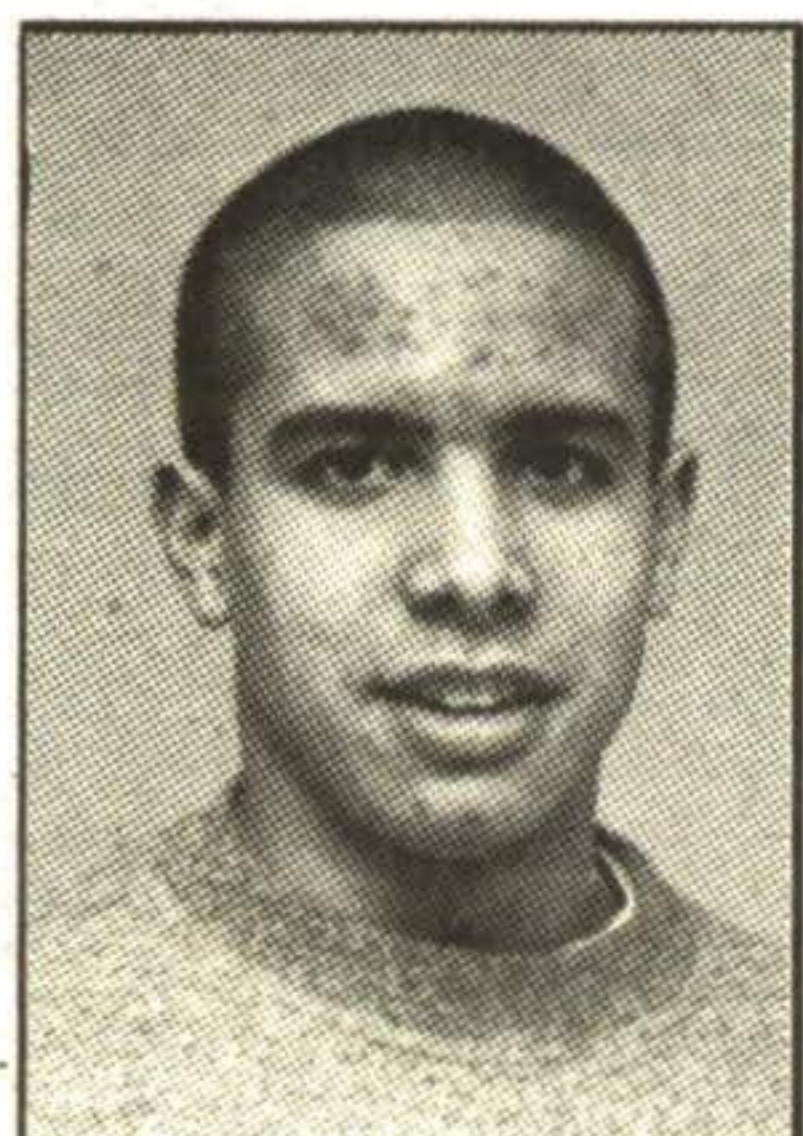


## Athletes of the Week
