GREEN THUMB GARDENING

SPRING SEEDING

*Seeds from hybrid plants are not worth saving to use the following season - the seeds produced by hybrid plants will not be the same as the seeds you planted (they do not breed true). The seed packet will state if they are hybrid's.

*Seeds that are stored properly, will remain viable for years. Place seeds in a sealed glass jar with a small cotton pouch filled with kitty litter. The kitty litter will absorb any moisture in the jar. Keep in a cool location.

*Do not start seeds too early (indoors) in the spring. For best results, start most seeds indoors during late March - Early April. When started too early, the seedlings are long, thin and spindly due to low light levels.

*Some seeds are so tiny that it is difficult to distribute evenly over the soil. Mix a little sand with the seeds and then sprinkle over the soil - the seeds will be spaced more appropriately.

*Jiffy 7's (compressed peat pellets) are neat and easy containers to start seeds and cuttings. Just add water to a tray lined with Jiffy 7's and they quickly expand into a self contained planting medium, but never let them dry out. When the plants are ready to set in the garden, just slip off mesh and pop the whole thing into the soil.

*How deep should you plant the seed? A general rule is to cover the seed twice the depth of its diameter. For example, 1/4" diameter seed should be planted 1/2" deep.
