



GREEN THUMB GARDENING

SPRING GARDEN GUIDE

The spring season is a busy time for gardeners. Winter days spent dreaming about this year's garden projects and plants can soon be put into action.

Use the following suggestions to get your garden to shape for your spring plans.

*Prune deciduous shade trees, except Maple, Birch and Beech (they are heavy bleeders). If required, thin crown, remove broken, dead and crossing branches.

*Apply dormant oil on Roses, Flowering Shrubs, Fruit and Shade trees. Only apply when temperatures are above zero and buds are not showing green color.

*Fertilize shrubs and trees in early spring.

*Fertilize lawn with high nitrogen, slow-release fertilizer. Do not use a weed-killer yet. However, pre-emergent crabgrass killer can be applied

*Thin lawns can be topdressed. Apply 1/4" fine topsoil over lawn. Spread grass seed at 1/2 the rate for a new lawn. Roll with an empty lawn roller. Keep evenly moist until seed germinates. Do not cut until it reaches 2-1/2 to 3 inches tall.

*Lift, divide and replant overgrown summer and fall blooming perennials.

*Pansies can be planted before other annuals since they can withstand frost.

* Do not prune spring flowering shrubs such as Lilac, Rhododendron, Azalea and Flowering Almonds.
