

Crime prevention officer seeks solution to violence

Crime Prevention

Officer

Violence is not just a youth problem or a policing problem.

"It is a societal problem," says Carol Buligan, the crime prevention officer for Georgetown.

"Working together with the schools, police and the community at large, perhaps we can reduce the amount of violence in our communi-

A possible solution, Buligan suggests, is to reach students before they get to high school through like programs Peacekeepers in which children are taught how to resolve differences and act as mediators for others in conflict.

Although violence does exist here, Halton is still one for the safest places to live in Canada.

The 1992 national aver-CAROL BULIGAN age for assaults was 838 per 100,000 population, compared to only 481 per 100,000 in Halton.

This information was contained in a study prepared by Buligan after concerns on youth violence were voiced by the Georgetown Community Consultation Committee.

Buligan analyzed the assaults which occurred in 1993 in north Halton, including Georgetown, Acton and Milton.

Thirty-five per cent of the victims were young people between 10

and 19 years of age. Thirty per cent of the offenders fell in the same age group.

In spite of what one hears about increasing violence in schools, only 10 per cent of the assaults took place in schools or were school related.

As part of a community policing initiative, each high school has a police officer spend a few hours in the school every week.

Initially, students thought something was wrong when they saw an officer in the school.

However, attitudes are changing and students are now often seeking out the officers and look forward to their visits.






