





Grass fires keeping local volunteers busy

There have been lots of grass fires, especially along the railway tracks, in Halton Hills this week.

The first occurred at 3:23 p.m. Monday along the CNR tracks near the Main St. N. bridge. Halton Hills firefighters believe this was started by a train which went past, and it was already out when they arrived.

Boys playing with fire crackers started another fire at 4:30 p.m. the same afternoon on Poplar Ave. in Acton. The fire was extinguished and the police talked to the boys.

Repair crews working by the CNR tracks at 15 Sideroad and Sixth Line Tuesday at lunchtime were grinding the tracks, and fire-fighters believe that this started a fire, which was under control when

they arrived. Another fire the next afternoon by the tracks at the Fifth Line was likely started in the same way. This fire, however, spread into a nearby farm, damaging ten rods of woven wire fence and some posts.

A fire at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday by the tracks behind Casa Ct. in Georgetown was likely caused by a passing train. The fire was extinguished with no problems.

Halton Hills firefighters were also called to the playground at Harrison School at 4 p.m. Wednesday. Some boys set some leaves on fire, and this spread to a neighbor's privacy fence, damaging about eight feet of it. Cost estimate of the damage was \$200.

New driver's licence will add extra security

A new machine-readable driver's licence being introduced this year will add an extra level of security for the province's 6.5 million drivers, said Transportation minister Gilles Pouliot recently.

"This licence will reduce fraud and make our records more accurate," said Pouliot. "Since it will be compatible with our police work stations and our court network, it will also be a step forward in enforcing our laws."

The new licence will look like a

credit card, with the driver's photograph and signature electronically printed on its surface. It will be phased in during a five-year period.

As it is issued to drivers, the Ministry of Transportation will retain digitized photographs and signatures on file as part of driver records.

The ministry is responsible for preventing improper use of the photographs and signatures, which are protected under Ontario's Protection of Privacy Act.
