Globe earns Thea Award

Georgetown Globe Productions' presentation of the hilarious musical comedy, *Me and My Girl*, received the coveted Thea Award for Best Musical at the Association of Community Theatres Festival, held in Markham on Saturday, April 23.

The award for Best Supporting Actor in a musical went to David Ambrose, who played the high-stepping family solicitor, Mr. Parchester. David is presently directing Globe's current show, *Anne of Green Gables*.

Three other members of the team involved in *Me and My Girl*,

which was presented in the fall of 1993, were honored at the festival. They were Vesta Jorgensen, who was nominated for the Best Director's award; Lois Fraser nominated for the Best Supporting Actress award for her role as the seductive Lady Jacqueline, and David W. Smith nominated for the Best Choreographer award.

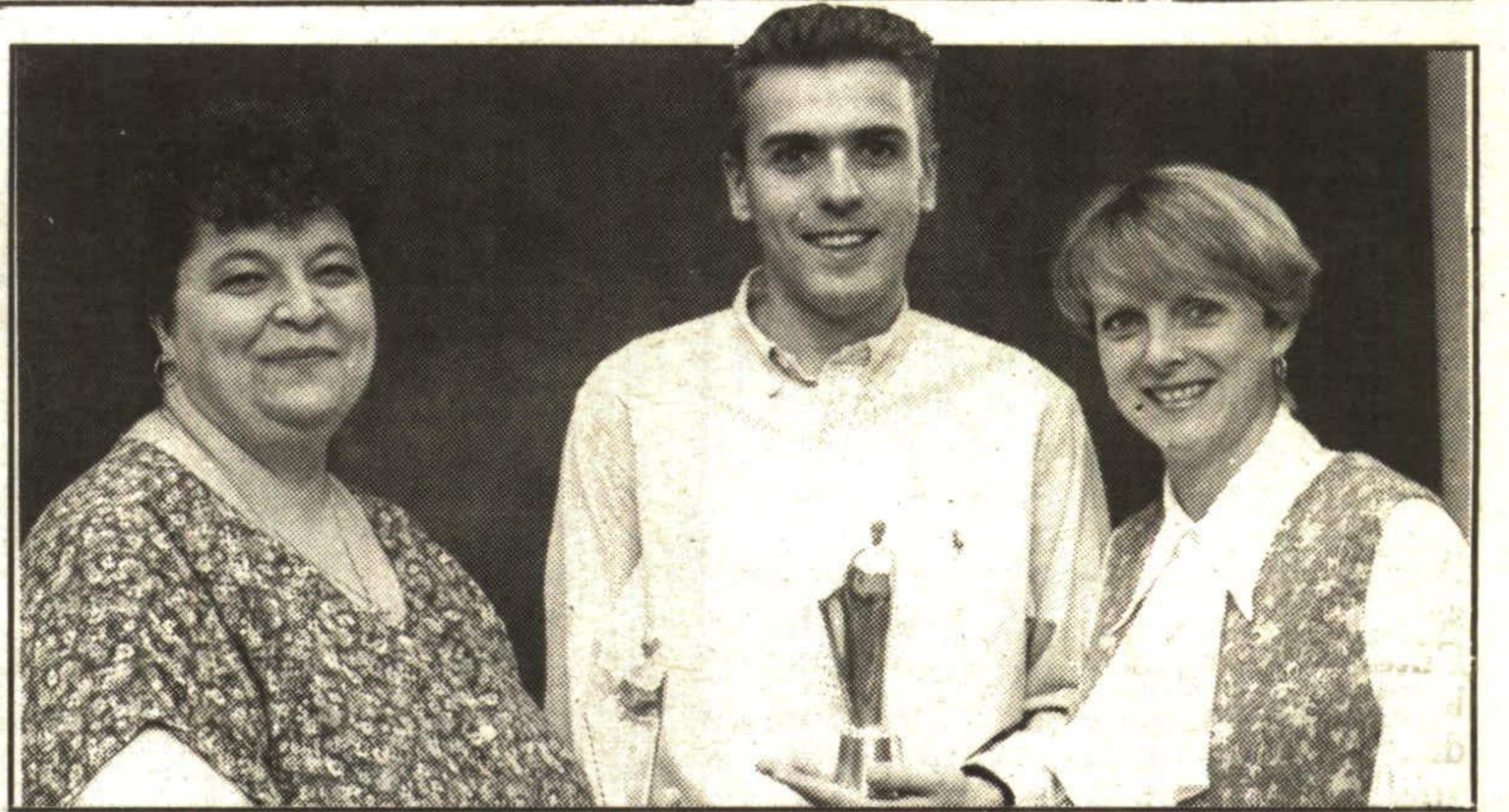
