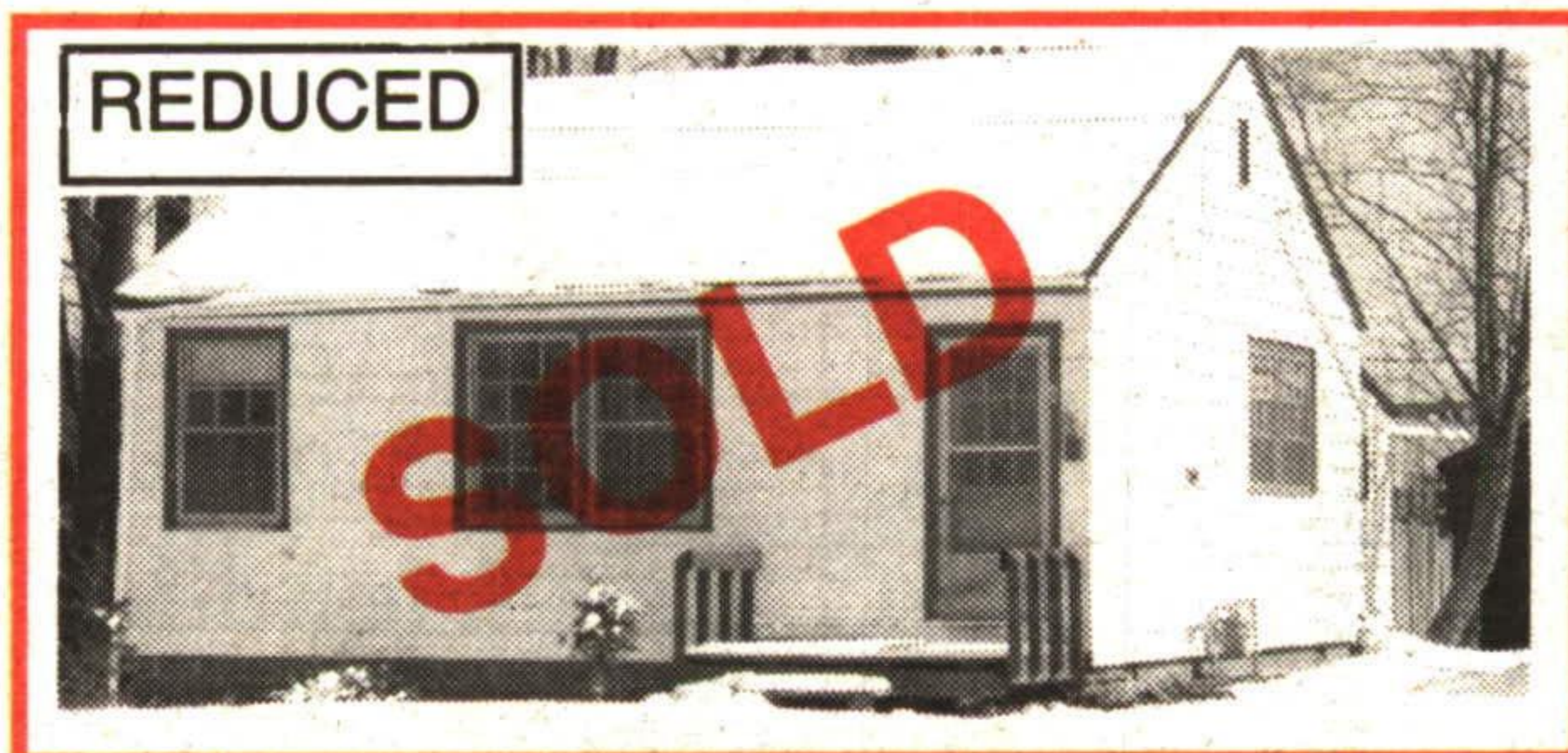

GREEN THUMB GARDENING

DIVIDING PERENNIALS

Over time perennial gardens tend to become cramped since they grow larger and larger each year. Eventually, many of them will become overcrowded. Typical signs of this include smaller and less numerous flowers, a decline in vigour, and the central portion of the clump dies or thins out.

Digging up the overcrowded plant and dividing it into two or more smaller clumps will rejuvenate it. Another consequence of this process is that the number of plants is increased. In fact, division is a common method of propagating more plants. Periodic and timely division restores the plant to a healthy, vigorous state. Large, overgrown clumps are easiest to divide when dug up and separated with two forks that are placed back to back and then forced apart. These and other small clumps can be easily divided and replanted. Summer and Fall flowering perennials are best divided in the Spring before growth begins. The following is a list of some common perennials that can be divided during the spring:

- Yarrow
- Coreopsis
- Columbine
- Bleeding Heart
- Silvermound (Wormwood)
- Purple Coneflower
- Astible
- Gaillardia
- Snow-In-Summer
- Geum
- Chrysanthemum
- Daylily
- Stoncrop
- Lupine
