Spring Bazaar

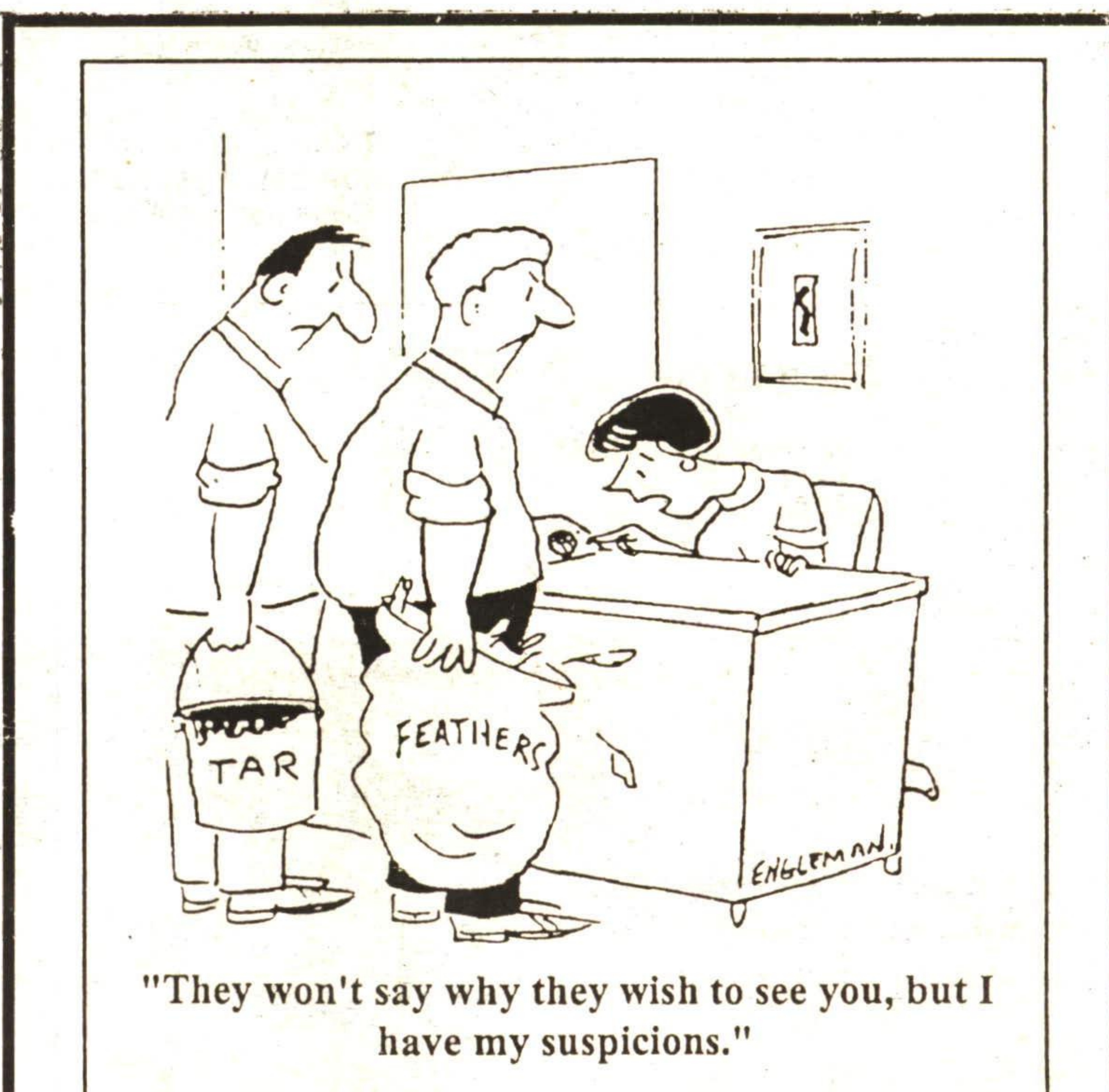

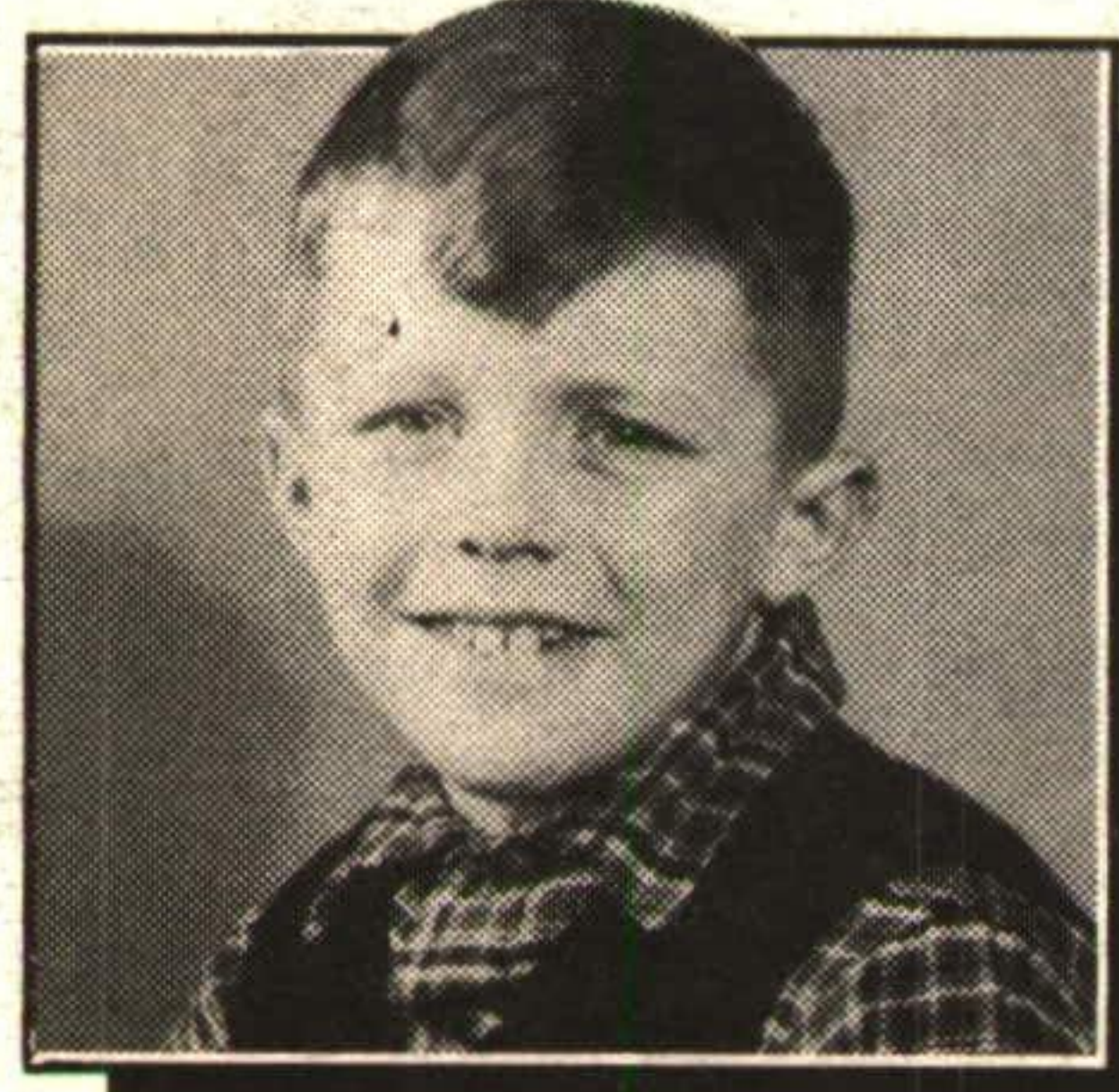
