WHY DOES YOUR LAWN NEED AERATION

Imagine this! Your dining room table. Now let's put a brown sponge (about 1" thick) on top of the table. Pour a litre of water onto your table. What happens? The water is soaked up by the sponge and the water that gets through runs off the edges of the table and onto the floor.

Now drill a dozen holes through the sponge and table. Now pour the water. What happens? The water drips through the holes and onto the floor.

This is why your lawn needs Aeration. With "clay" soil and 1" of thatch (or sponge) in your lawn, the water, fertilizer and air cannot get through to the roots. The roots of the grass are the "heart" of the plant. The easier the roots can get water, air and fertilizer, the healthier your lawn will be.

A healthy lawn is more resistant to insect damage, water and heat stress and diseases. Aeration is the most beneficial lawn care service you can do to your lawn. It's best done once per year in the spring or the fall. You can not "over" Aerate your lawn. It doesn't matter what the condition of your lawn is, poor or excellent, Aeration will always help.
