

Future teachers taught at Speyside

Teacher-candidates, the new term for student teachers, are working in two schools in Halton Hills — Robert Little and Brookville School.

Rita Maret, the former principal of Robert Little, and who has been seconded to York University, is teaching these future teachers through the program operated out of the old Speyside School.

Recently a reception was held for all the teacher-candidates, prin-

cipals and teachers from host schools. The teacher-candidates had put together displays on topics which interested them.

"These people were allowed to chose any educational topic that they saw as being valuable. They research a current topic and produce a portfolio. Then they have something they can take to a job interview or use as a display for when they have their own classroom," Maret said.

She said that she is optimistic that the job market for teachers will open up again in two years, as a result of retirements.

Many of this group of 84 students currently in the program at York have applied two or three times before getting accepted, Maret said. Many have alternative plans, in case they don't get jobs when the program ends; some plan to work as supply teachers or instructional assistants.

Bassett, who is medication free, refers to herself as "completely recovered" and travels the country, presenting seminars to such companies as Chrysler, AT&T and McDonald's. She has been featured on OPRAH, REGIS and KATHY LEE and many other shows.
