

# DARE recognizes community support

DARE Halton, the non-profit fundraising organization of the DARE (Drug Abuse Resistance Education) program recognized the overwhelming community response to the DARE Community Walk-a-thon, which was last fall.

A special plaque-mounted Certificate of Recognition was presented to the principals of each of the 32 elementary Catholic schools of the Halton Roman Catholic School Board, who hosted and participated in the Walk-a-thon and to a number of community sponsors of the event.
