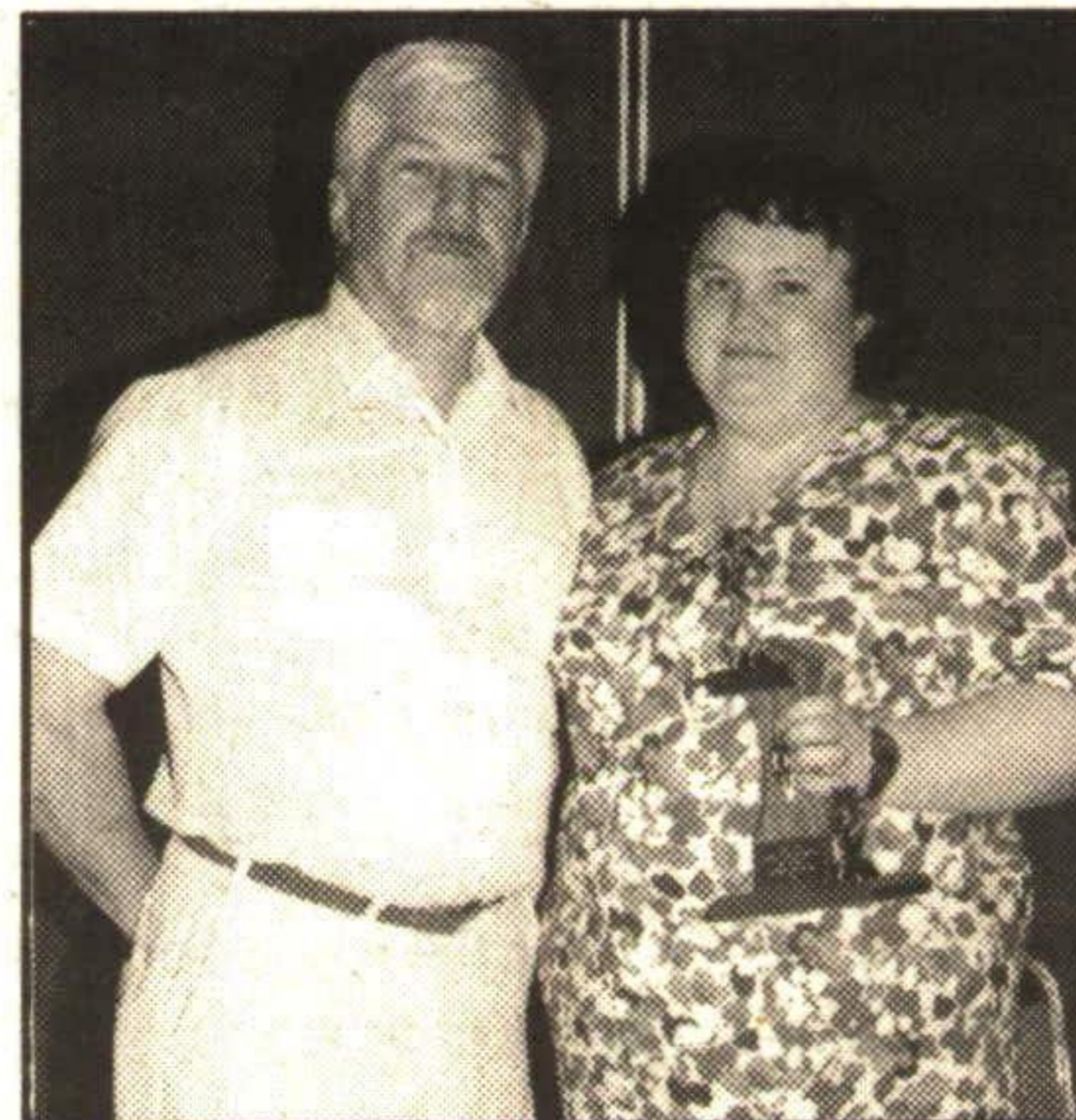
#### Bats come alive

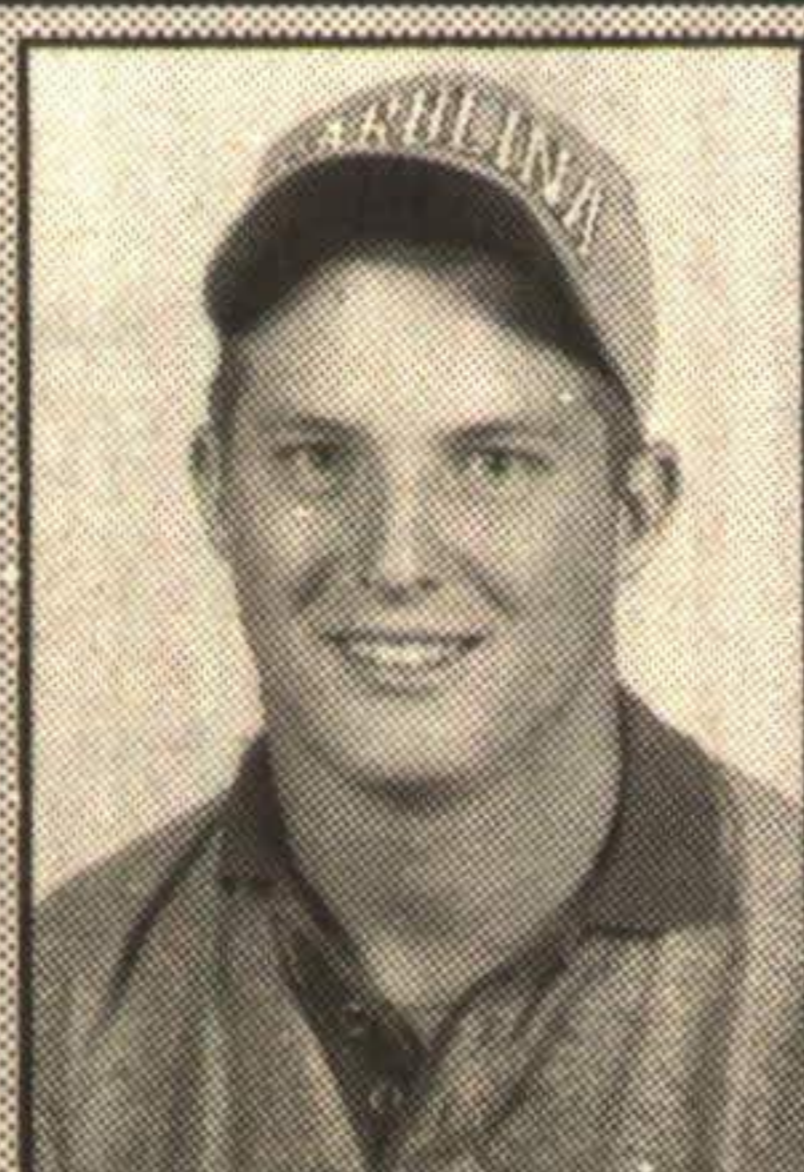


## Athletes of the Week
