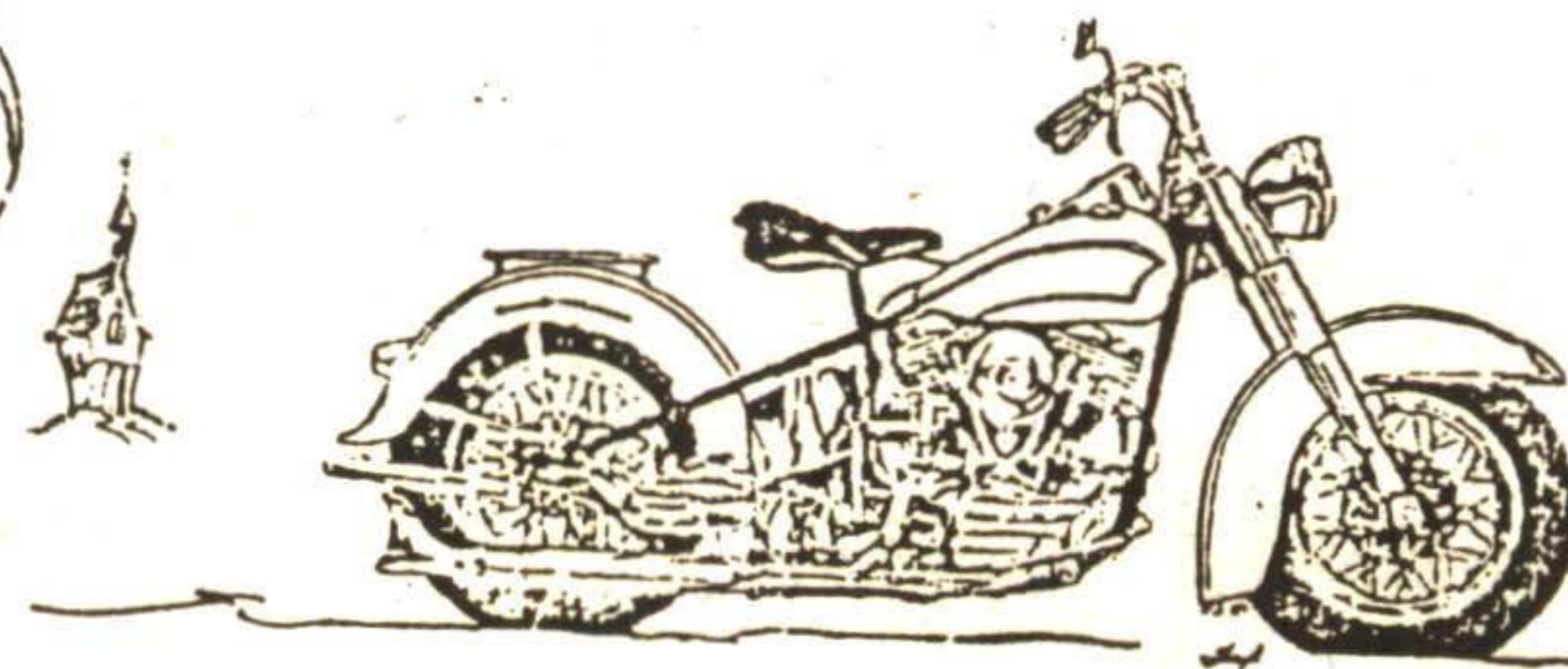

## Students win silver at technical competition

On May 17, students from Georgetown District High School competed in the Provincial Skills Competitions at Copps Coliseum in Hamilton and came home with silver.

After receiving a bronze medal for Construction Technology/Team in the Halton Technical Olympics at Blakelock High School on April 23, Ryan Hutchins and Steve Clark did not originally qualify for the provincial competitions, however, the team was able to go after space became available.

The Georgetown team placed second for Construction Technology Team. The competitors had to frame a wall, fasten it together with a window in it, run wiring through it, add a plug, drywall it and finish the wall. Both received cordless drills as gifts.

Of the 23 competitions entered, Halton Board of Education received a total of seven gold medals, six silver medals and five bronze medals.

The medal winners from the Ontario Skills Competition then had the opportunity to compete in the first annual Canadian Skills Olympics held at Copps Coliseum, May 18 and 19. The Halton students were part of the Skills Canada Ontario Team and competed against teams from Quebec, Alberta, British Columbia and Kentucky, winning five medals.

David Wray of Acton High School received a silver medal in Architectural Design-CAD and will be on his way to Kansas City next weekend to compete in the United States Skills Competition. Read about David's success in our Wednesday edition, June 22.

## Public meeting

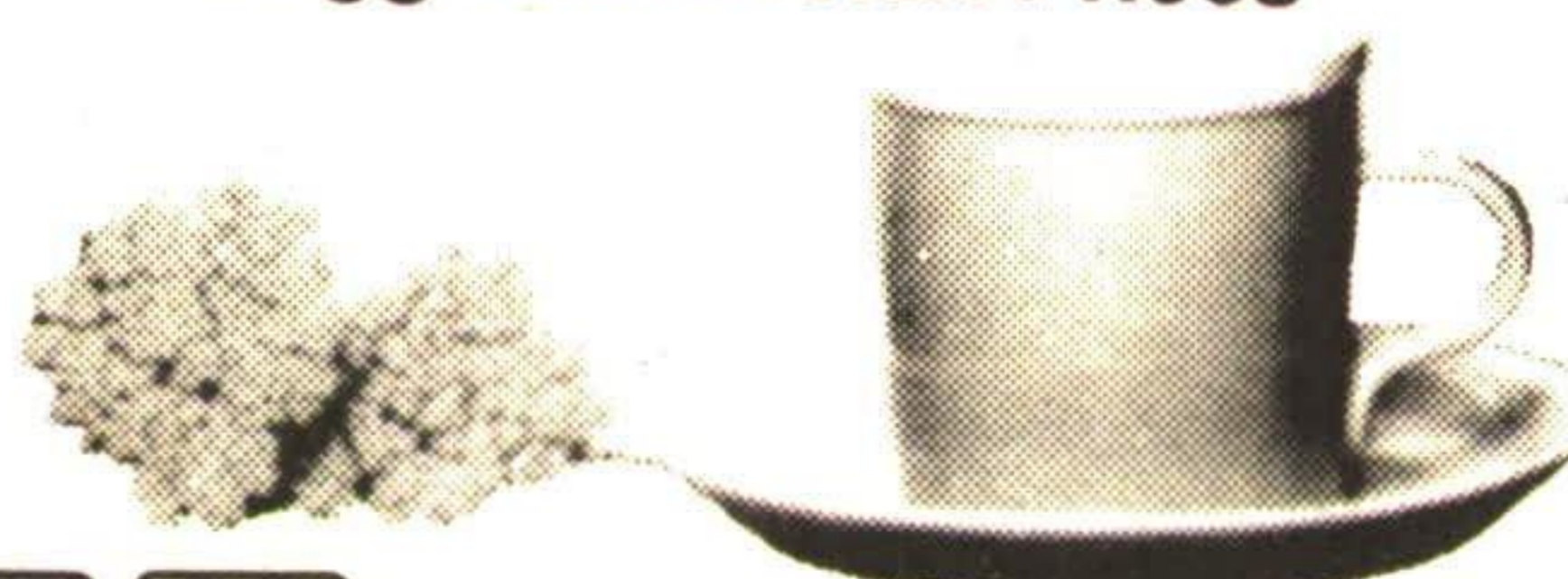
A Public Information Centre is being held June 22 for Halton's Class Environmental Assessment for Additional Water Supply for the Georgetown Urban Area. There will be visual displays and staff and members of the Public Liaison Committee including citizens and business representatives will be available to answer your questions 6-9 p.m. at the Civic Centre.

An initial screening of alternative ways to provide the additional capacity has been completed including a supply system from Lake Ontario, Georgian Bay, the Credit River and local groundwater aquifers. The Class EA is being carried out because there is insufficient water supply to service the planned population of 40,000 for the Georgetown urban area which includes the hamlets of Glen Williams, Stewarttown and Norval.

A second Public Information Centre will be held later this year to present the preferred alternative.
