Two for the Tigers

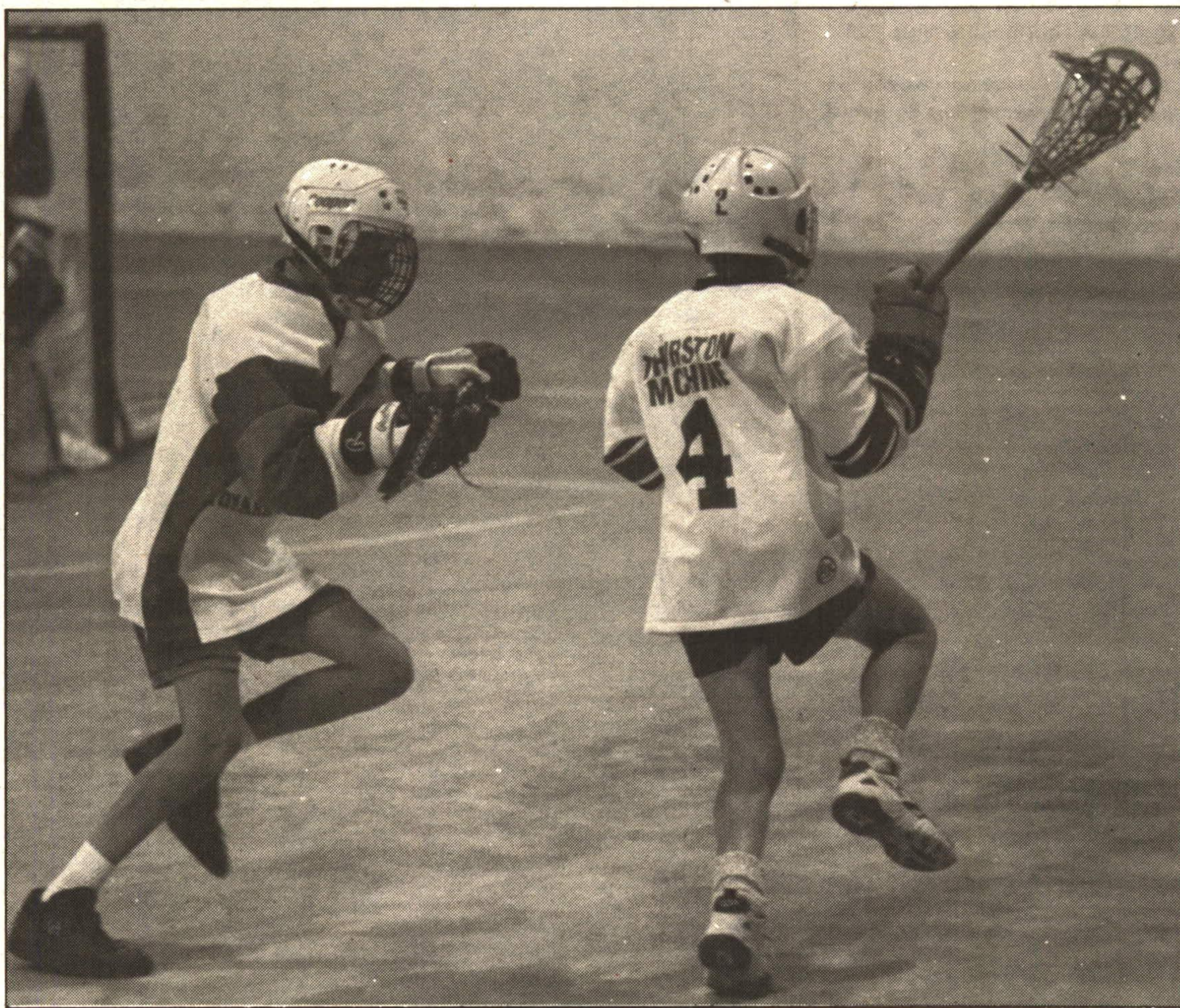

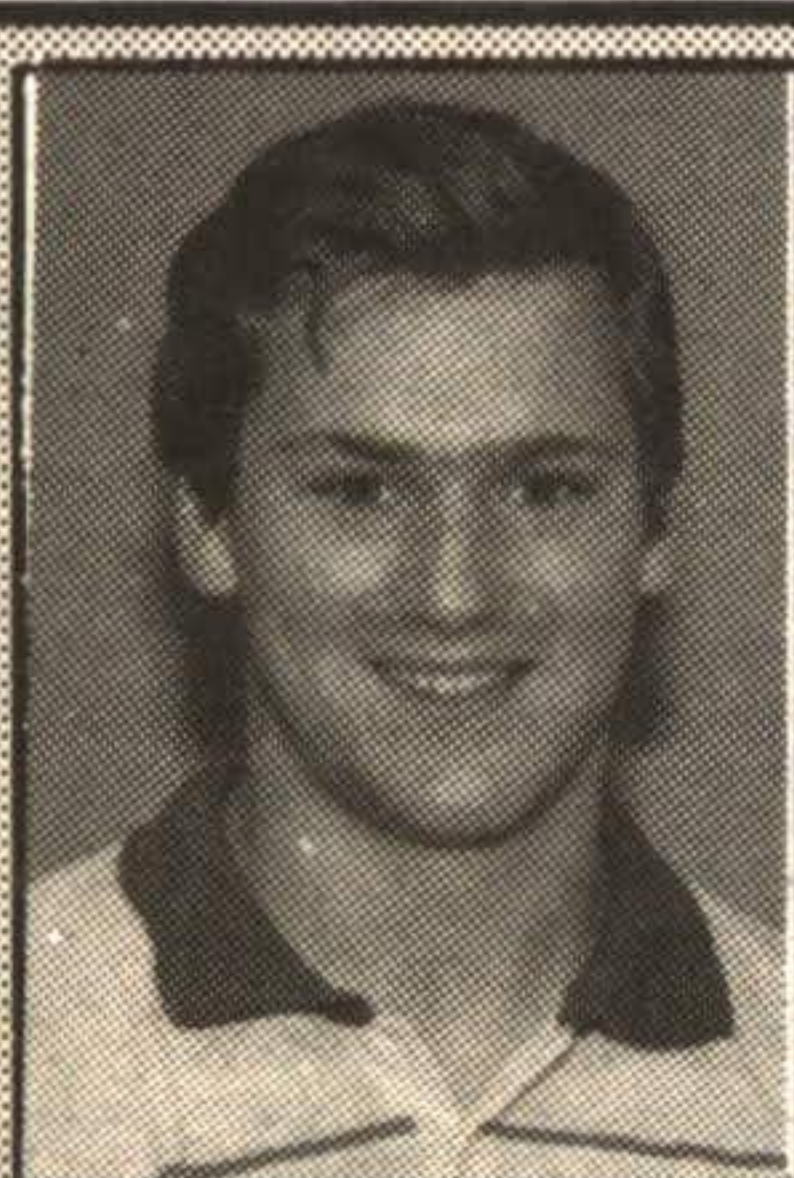
