



#### SAVE \$\$\$\$ ON YOUR WATER BILL


I have heard many people tell me that grass needs a lot of water in order for it to stay green and healthy. Although grass does need some water to stay green in the summer, it really does not need that much. In actual fact, shrubs and flowers need more water than grass. Grass is one of the only "plants" that has the ability to go completely dormant during drought conditions, and rejuvenate itself once the weather cools and the rains come.

So, how do you save on your water bill? During hot/dry weather, keep your lawn cut at 2-1/2 inches. Water makes your grass green. The taller the grass, the more water it can hold. Therefore the grass will be greener and healthier. If the grass is healthier, it will be able to recuperate from drought much quicker. Don't forget to keep your mower blade sharpened.

To utilize the water that you put on your lawn, keep these things in mind: 1. Water in the morning, up until 11:00 a.m. (some people set their sprinkler up before they go to bed and turn it on as soon as they get up, and then turn it off before they go to work). 2. Water for at least 1 hour. 3. For larger areas use a sprinkler that produces large droplets as oppose to a "mist". A "mist" sprinkler is good in smaller areas. 4. DO NOT WATER AFTER 7:00 P.M. (this may result in disease). 5. Measure how much water your sprinkler puts down by placing a can within the spread of your sprinkler and time how long it takes to fill the can to 3/4 of an inch. Now water your lawn for this time period, 2 times per week and you will be giving your lawn 1-1/2 inches of water per week. The amount of water needed for your lawn may vary, depending on your soil type.

Finally, Aeration! I refer to aeration quite often in my Turf Tips. I do this because Aeration affects everything that is done to your lawn, including Water. A lawn that has been aerated will utilize water more efficiently by making it easier to get down to the roots. Now the water will run down to the roots instead of running down to the sidewalk.
