

### GREEN THUMB GARDENING

## Miner

Are your cedar trees, shrubs or hedges looking more brown than usual? If so, you may be inclined to chalk it up to winter injury or sun scald. However, there is another possibility, Cedar (Arborvitae) Leaf Miner.

This insect overwinters inside the flattened foliage tips of the cedar. In the spring you can identify its presence by snapping off a piece of the browned foliage. A normal leaf will be solid inside but one that has been attacked by the leafminer will be hollow. You may even squeeze out the larvae if you squish the piece gently. By early to mid June the adults emerge. These are tiny, very triangular shaped mothers that are silver-grey in color with a few darker spots on their wings. If you suspect that the browning tips of your cedar plants may be caused by this pest, then to check for it at this time of year, simply shake the shrub gently and watch for these moths fluttering out. They are not very good flyers so watch for them on the ground as well.

If they are present, you can control the adults now with an appropriate insecticide such as Malathion or Diazinon. By August the larvae will have developed inside the foliage again. A systemic insecticide should be used at that time to prevent them from overwintering in the leaves of your cedar.
