GREEN THUMB GARDENING



By CHRISTINE COLE Are Aphids 'Bugging' Your Plants

Aphids are small, soft-bodied insects that range in color from a transparent green, grey, beige to red. Aphids have piercing/sucking mouthparts with which they suck the juices from the plant. Aphids tend to congregate on the succulent growing tips of plants and cause a number of different symptoms.

Green and pink aphids are common on rose. They suck the sap from the stems under the flowers and buds, which leads to minor wilting and poor plant growth. The leaves may also become curled and distorted.

On the snowball bush or shrub the grey or green aphids feed on the newly-developing leaves and cause them to curl extensively and become distorted. The final result is that the shrub is stunted and unsightly.

There are two different aphids that often infect spruce trees. Their feeding results in the development of thick oval galls that resemble small pineapples. The galls cause the tips of the twigs to twist and eventually turn brown.

All aphids produce a sweet honeydew that attracts ants and other insects. In addition, the honeydew is an ideal medium for development of the sooty mold disease (a black powdery substance). If the aphids are controlled properly and promptly it will suppress their physical damage to plants, the presence of ants, and sooty mold. Aphids can be controlled when noticed on plants with most all-purpose insecticides such as Malathion, Sevin and Diazinon.
