One of a kind show next weekend

The Ontario Agricultural Museum is celebrating the 10th anniversary of its Great Canadian Antique Tractor Field Days on July 16 and 17 with a line up of activities not to be missed.

The only show of its kind, this event is devoted to Canadian-made farm machinery and serves as a fun-filled lesson on Ontario history.

Returning this year is the Farm Toy Sale and Show, with more than 55 tables of unique farm toys for purchase and display. Visitors during the "Great Canadian" will be able to fill out a ballot to win a toy Cockshutt 30 tractor, worth approx \$125, donated by Teeswater Custom Tractor.

The real life inspiration for these toys will be on display as visitors explore one of the largest and rarest collections of operating steam engines and tractors in the province, including Ontario's oldest tractor — a 1911 single-cylinder Fairbanks-Morse.

Members of The Canadian Wheelmen will be displaying a variety of antique bicycles, a new feature at this year's event.


