

Love history? Love museums? Join the Halton Museum steering committee

The Halton Region invites applications for membership on the Halton Region Museum Feasibility Study Steering Committee (FSSC). Anyone with good communication skills who is prepared to devote time for meetings and the review of reports and technical documents is encouraged to apply. Individuals with backgrounds in heritage, business, education, or community development are par-

ticularly needed for this committee. Applications, which are available from the Town of Milton Municipal Offices and the Halton Region Museum, should be submitted by 4:30 p.m. on Friday, August 19, to William Roberts, Town Clerk, Town of Milton Municipal Office, Victoria Park Square, Box 1004, Milton, Ontario L9T 4B6. The Halton Region Museum

FSSC will determine the feasibility of establishing the Halton Region Museum, presently located in Kelso Conservation Area, at the historic Sproat/Martin House site in Milton. The completion of the feasibility process is expected to take approximately 12 months. Under the chairman of local and regional Councillor Brad Clements, FSSC members will obtain public input on the proposal,

examine all related issues, direct the consulting architect, prepare draft plans, and make recommendations to Halton and Milton councils. Since 1962, the Halton Region Museum has been leasing buildings in Kelso Conservation Area. In 1988, due to the inadequacy of the Kelso site, the Region of Halton started searching for a new museum site. In 1994, with the support

of the Town of Milton, it agreed to examine the possibility of the Sproat/Martin House site in Milton's Livingstone Park.
