CMHA hosts video party

Courses available this session are:
 Watercolour and Mixed Media Workshop for Adults — on Sunday, Sept. 25, from 9:30 a.m. until 3 p.m.

Pencil and Charcoal Drawing — for six Thursdays beginning Sept. 22, from 7 until 9 p.m.

Beginner Weaving — for five Wednesdays beginning Oct. 26. Group A - mornings from 9 a.m. until 11:30 a.m. Group B - evenings from 7 p.m. until 9:30 p.m.

Pottery for Adults — Beginner and Intermediate for 10 weeks. Group A -

beginning Sept. 21, afternoons from 12:30 p.m. until 3:30 p.m. Group B - beginning Sept. 22, evenings from 7 p.m. until 10 p.m.

Stained Glass — Beginner and Intermediate for six Tuesdays beginning Sept. 20, from 7 p.m. until 10 p.m.

For children there are two courses:

Drawing Fundamentals for Children — aged 9-12 years for three Sundays beginning Oct. 2, from 2 p.m. until 4 p.m.

Pottery for Children — aged 7-10 years for three Saturdays beginning Oct. 8, from 10 a.m. until noon.

These courses are all held at the Cedarvale Cottage at Main St. and Maple Avenue, Georgetown. The classes are

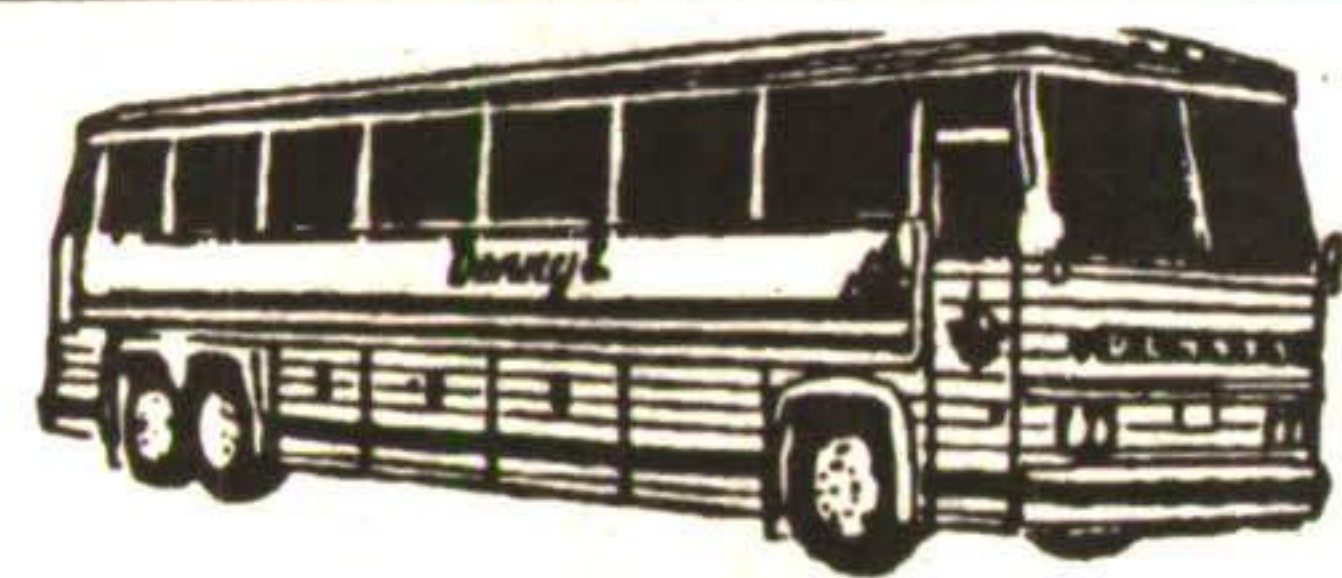
small so students get close attention from the instructor.

The courses are filled on a registration paid basis, first come first served. Some of the courses fill quickly so prompt registration is advised...particularly the children's courses. There is a minimum number of registrants required for a course to run with a deadline one week prior to the first class.

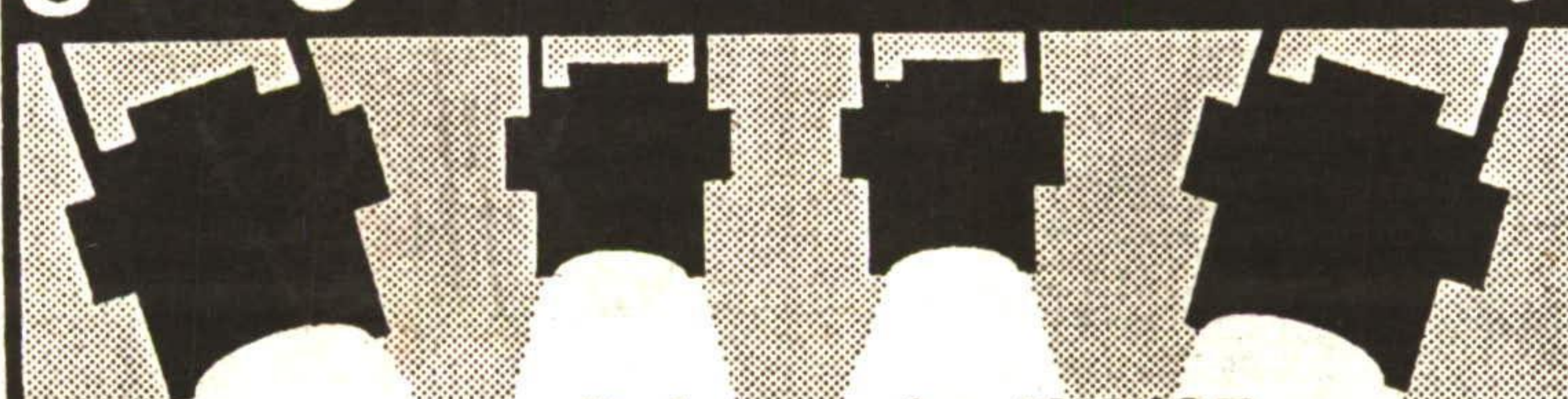
