

Rookie Eagles back in flight

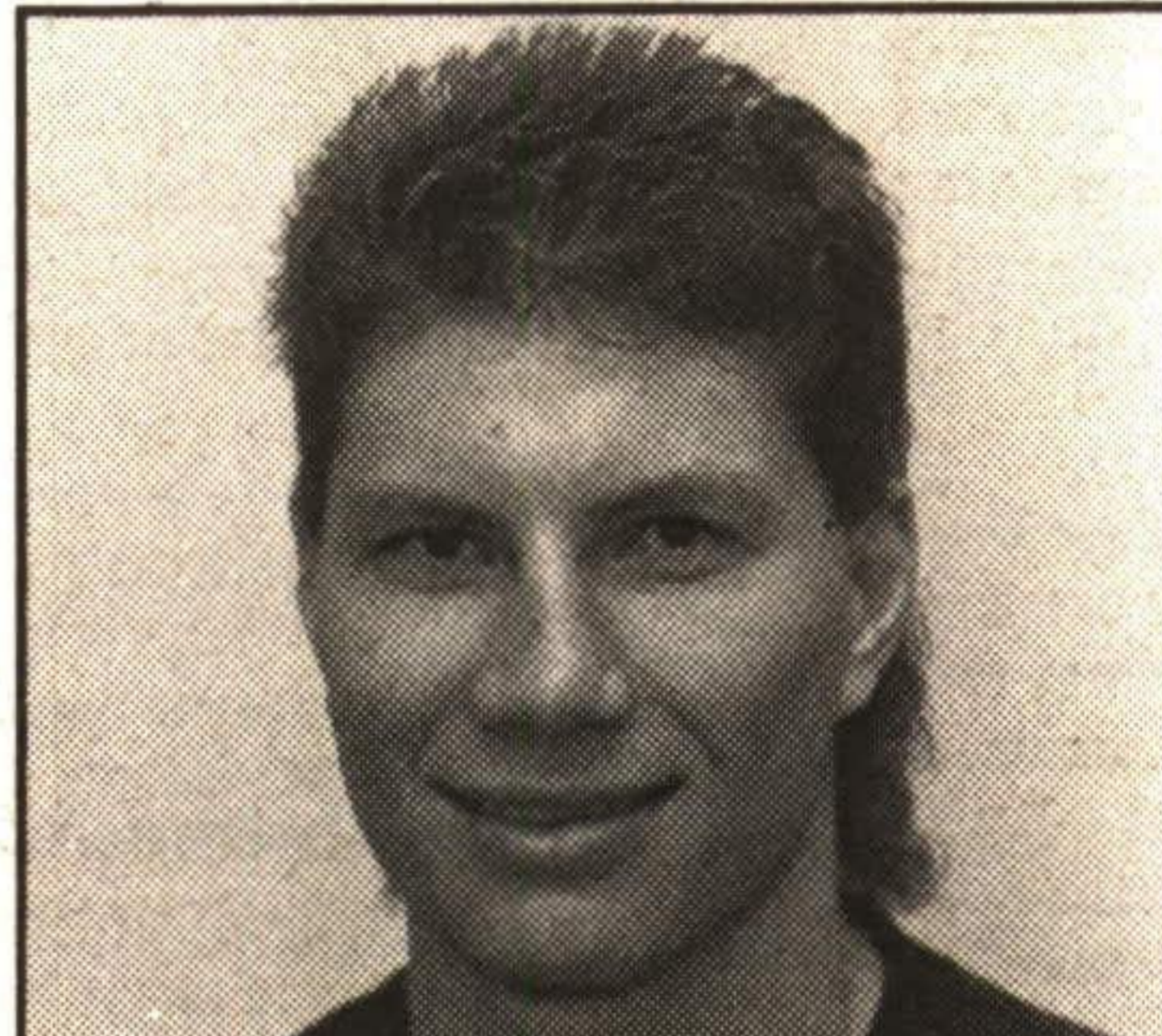

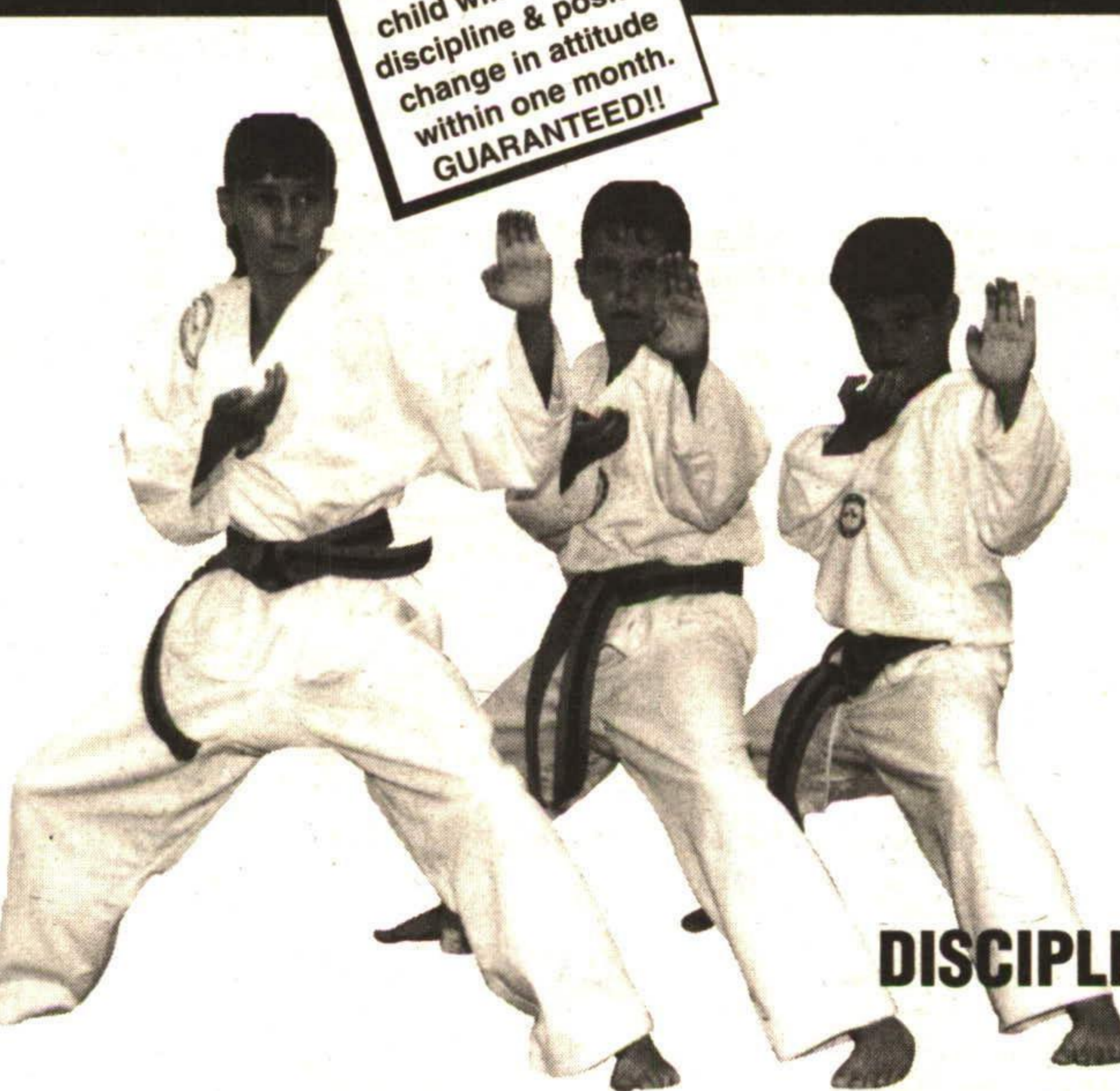
