**MOWING YOUR LAWN**

The appearance and health of your lawn is maintained by mowing your lawn at the proper height. A common, very serious error is to mow lawns too short!  
 A lawn should always be mowed at least 5 to 6 cm (2 to 2-1/2 inches) above the ground. Mowing height should be increased during the heat of summer. Grasses require the longer cut to survive the summer heat and drought.  
 The lawn should be mowed frequently so that only a small clipping is taken from the grass plant. Never remove more than 1/3 of the total grass blade when mowing.  
 Mower blades should be kept razor sharp. This sharp cut will make a clean wound that will heal quickly, look tidy and resist disease attack. It may be necessary to have mower blades sharpened 2-3 times yearly. Ideally, the best time to mow your lawn is early morning.

**Self-esteem series offered**

Gloria Steinem once said "It's not that self-esteem is everything. It's just that there is nothing without it."  
 Many people have been "downsized" and "outplaced" from jobs they've held responsibly for years. Others have experienced the painful reality of divorce. They're left feeling hopeless, helpless and doubting their self worth.  
 Because a good sense of self is essential in helping people cope with the changes in their lives, the Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA) will offer for the first time in Georgetown, Understanding Self-Esteem beginning Wednesday, Sept 7.  
 Major life changes and crises can leave people feeling shaken and unsure of themselves, according to Peggy Grall, program director for support services at CMHA. Feeling confident and secure in who you are is the best defense against the depression and apathy that can plague people as they meet these challenges, she said.  
 Understanding Self-Esteem is a new six-week educational and experiential series which will be offered at the Halton Hills Library and Cultural Centre, 9 Church Street, Cultural Centre Room. It will run Wednesday, at 7:30 to 9 p.m. from Sept. 7-28. The fee is \$65 and pre-registration is essential.  
 The series begins with participants completing a personal self-esteem inventory. Subsequent subjects include looking at self-limiting and irrational belief systems, assessing communication patterns, setting more effective goals, overcoming destructive habits and learning to reflect your authentic self.
