The casting, entitled Reaching for Excellence will be unveiled Thursday, September 29, at 4 p.m., in the front foyer of Georgetown High School (GDHS).

The project has been delayed numerous time due to back luck.

The original concept of the statue was conceived by GDHS student Sheila Allison Schultz, but the unfortunate death of Schultz in a car accident halted the project until sculptor Siglinde Knoespel decided to carry on and sculpt the project, using Allison's concept of many hands reaching out.

The name, Reaching for Excellence, was chosen from 14 entries of suggestions. The committee members were undecided between Reaching for learning or knowledge, and Excellence is worth reaching for, so they combined the two, to make Reaching for Excellence.

The sculpture was cast at Artcast Inc., of Georgetown, and Artcast subsidized part of the cost of the casting, while former GDHS student Vince Graham installed the casting at the high school.


