Rowland earns individual bronze at Pan Am Games

Georgetown's Katie Rowland made the most of her first international gymnastics meet last month when she collected four medals at the 1994 Junior Pan Am Games in Mexico.

Rowland, 13, was part of the fourmember junior squad that competed at the Pan Am Games September 22 and 23 in Monterrey, Mexico.

Katie first helped Canada earn the sil-

ver medal in team competition, and then qualified for individual competition where she was third overall and scored the bronze.

She also took home bronze medals for her performance on the beam and her floor routine, with scores of 9.275 and 9.5 respectively, and was the top Canadian junior in individual competition.

Rowland qualified to compete at the Pan Am Games back in May when she earned the bronze medal at the Canadian National Gymnastics Championships in

Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island.

This was the second straight year that Katie had medaled at the Canadian Nationals. In 1993, she took home the silver medal.

Rowland was also part of the sevenmember senior team that competed in a duel meet in England early last month.

With a late injury to one of the senior members, Katie was a last minute substitute and made her first showing in senior competition.

With some impressive results in floor

routine and on the beam, she helped Canada earn the gold medal and the win over Great Britain — who won the gold medal at this summer's Commonwealth Games in Victoria, British Columbia.

Katie has been competing in gymnastics for seven years now and is currently a member of the Winstonettes in Markham. Her next big challenge will be to retain her High Performance status at Elite Canada in Montreal this December, when she makes the jump to the senior division circuit.

Glen Oomen was the top senior boys runner for the Rebels and finished seventh.






