"We wanted to schedule the concert so veterans could attend


Remembrance Day services during the day, then come out to the concert that evening," says Schenk, "That way, they can enjoy the entire day, and not miss a service."

Following the concert, a reception with coffee and desserts will be held in the church hall, allowing veterans time to visit and remi-


The Remembrance Concert is one of many activities Georgetown Choral Society is involved in as part of the 50th anniversary of the liberation of Europe.




