MSA committee needs Halton Hills' support

A Multi-Service Agency (MSA) aims to provide a single access to a wide variety of community based services by integrating programs that are now provided by several different agencies. Programs such as home making, meals and transportation programs, personal care, and support for daily living are intended to assist seniors and adult disabled to live independently in their own homes and communities.

Serving the Region of Halton, the District Health Council's Long Term Care Committee voted to establish a central MSA for Halton with four local service areas, one of which would be in Halton Hills.

A Halton Hills Committee has worked on this issue for several years and concluded that a local MSA would best meet the needs of this community and requested support from the Halton Long Term Care committee to proceed immediately with its establishment.

The Long Term Care Committee did not support the proposal at that time nor since then.

Helen Dubeau, chair of the Halton Hills MSA Committee and ASSIC Board member said, "We are very distressed by the length of time that this process has taken and by the committee's decision. The effort, commitment and views of our community have apparently been completely disregarded. 




