"Some (parameters) are worse than we thought, many are better," said Leung. "The key component, ammonia, is in better condition than we anticipated. We have confirmed that the sewage treatment plant is operating well and that there are some contaminants coming downstream from the upper reaches of the water course."

Leung added the region has been able to demonstrate to the agencies that a second year of test pumping is not required.

Leung added the studies being done in Acton are the most comprehensive and complex the region has ever seen.

"I credit the board with keeping the momentum going through pressure on the various agencies and to the developers for participating in the funding of the studies," said Leung.

The Acton developers have picked up half the \$270,000 tab for the studies.

The final report on the studies is expected from the region on Jan. 31 1995 and a draft implementation plan outlining what improvements may have to be made, and associated costs is expected by December 1994.

After the final report is completed it will be presented to regional and town councils so a decision can be made about whether or not the necessary improvements are affordable.

Also at Wednesday's meeting future hearing dates, all at Halton Hills council chambers, were set by the board. The parties are to meet Feb. 6 for a pre-hearing update, March 8, 9, and 10 to deal with updates and motions and for three weeks beginning April 25. Depending on the outcome of the studies, whether or not servicing will have to be phased in Acton, or if approval is not granted for the full 10,000 population the three weeks could result in the developers fighting for a piece of the development action in Acton.
