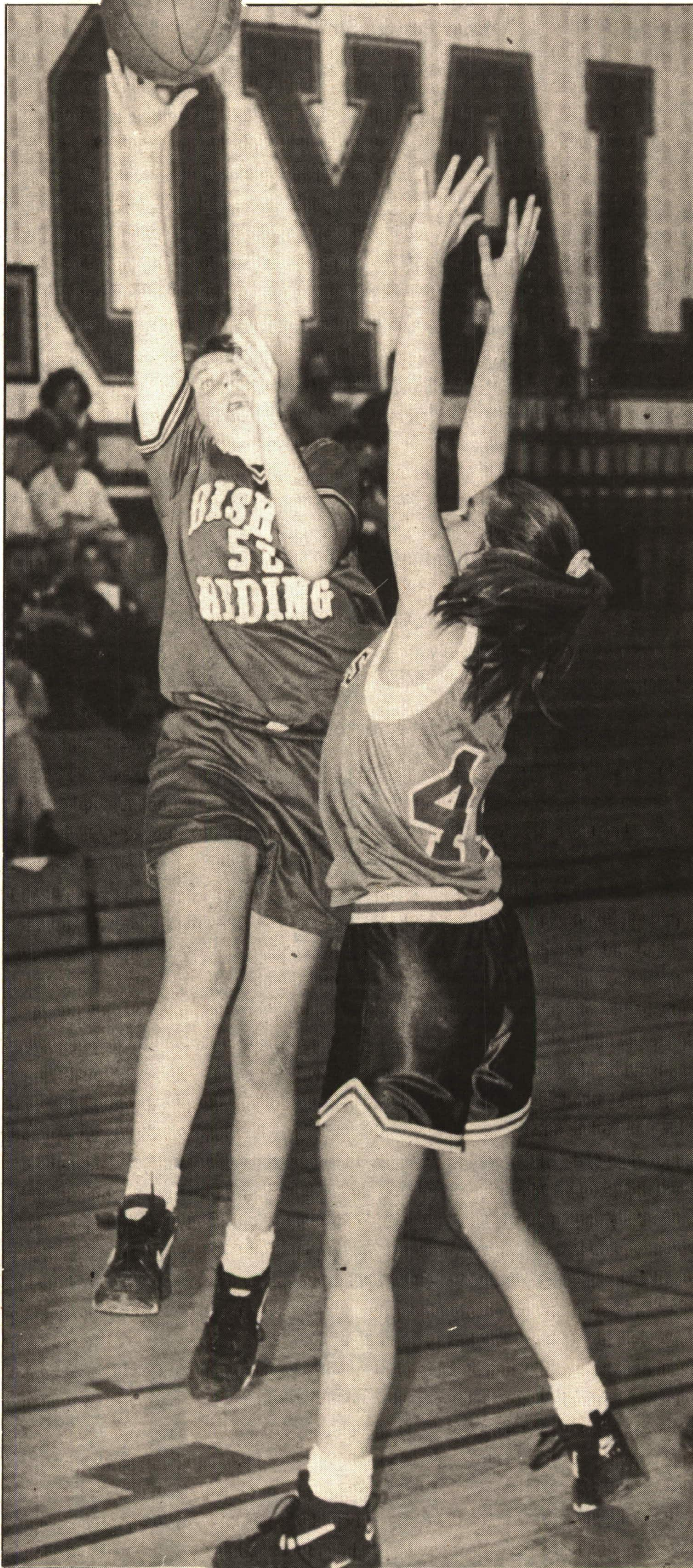
SkyDome Cup

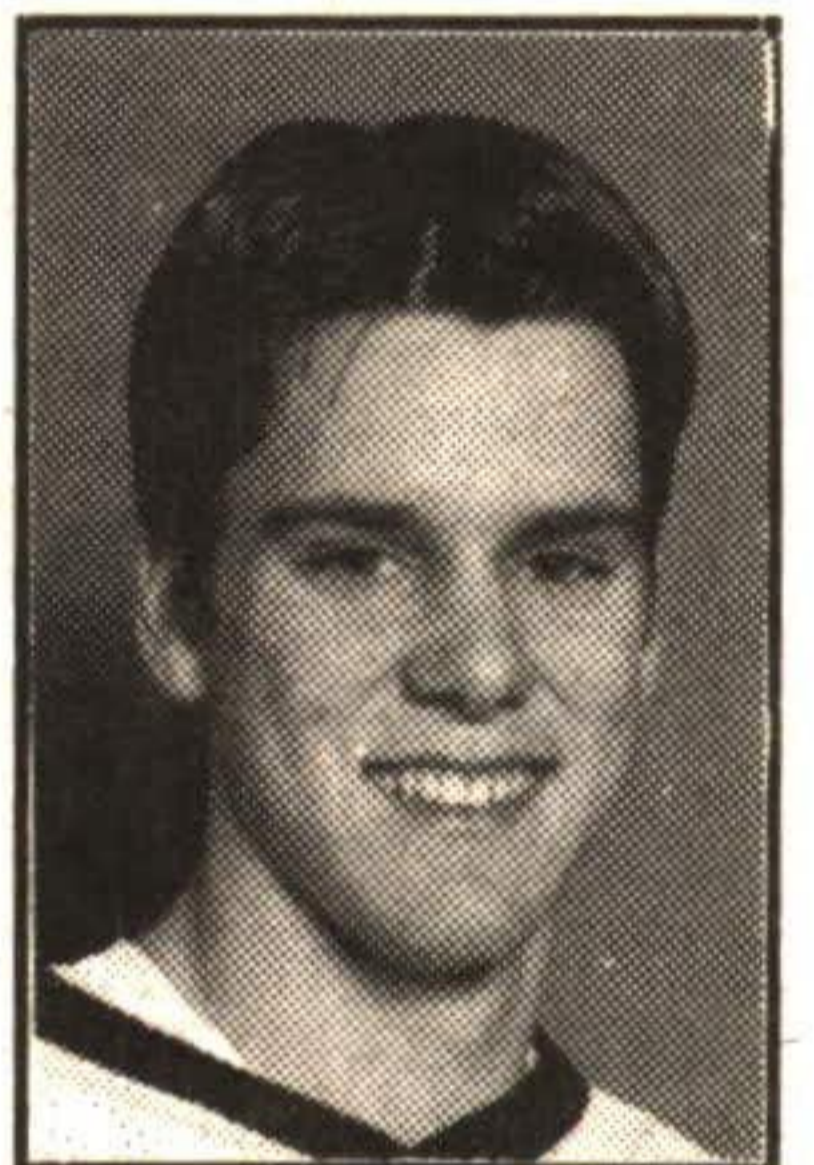
Last year's Thursday bus was fully booked with a waiting list, so the club is launching an additional bus on Tuesdays.

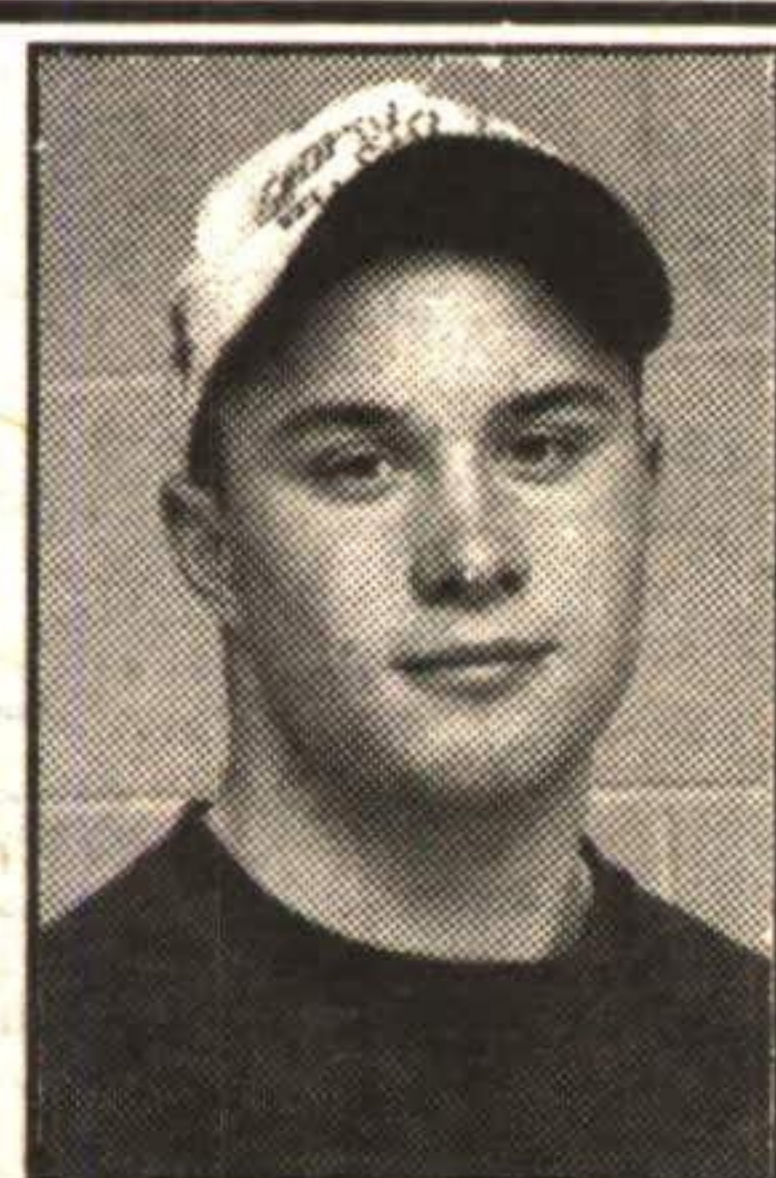
Most member are hard pressed to find a better way to enjoy winter and can hardly wait for the snow to fly.

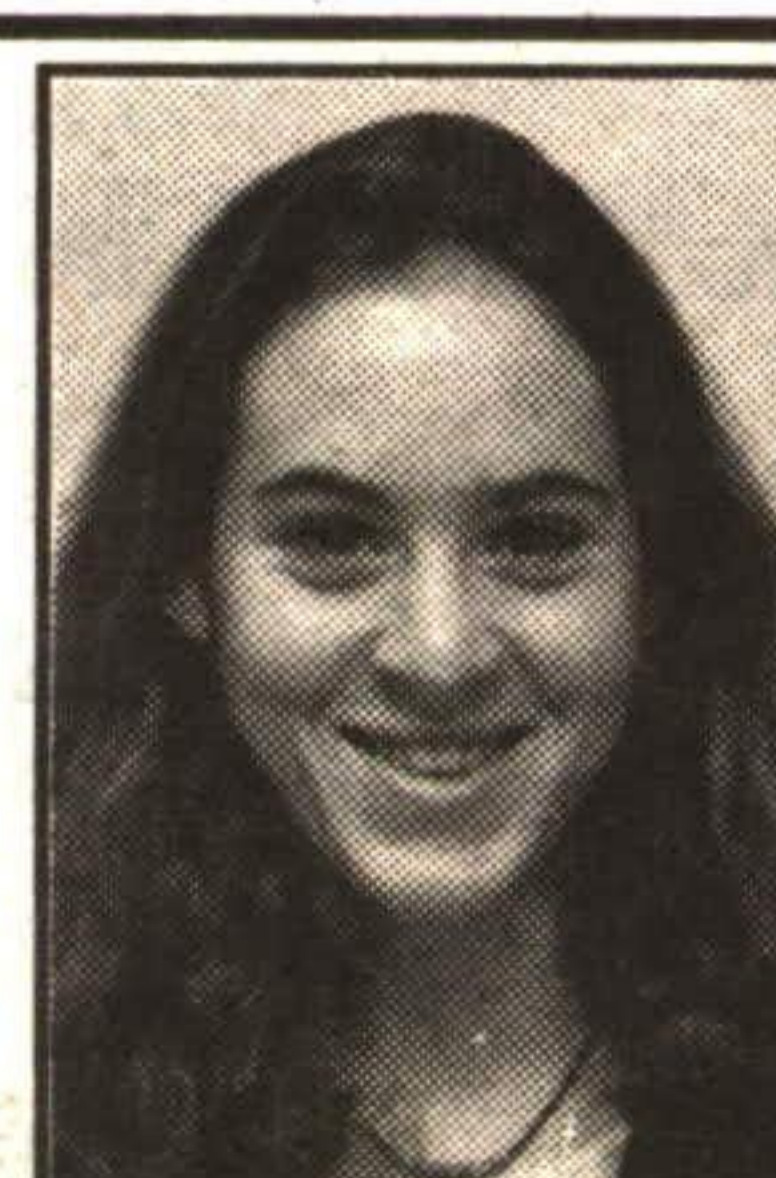

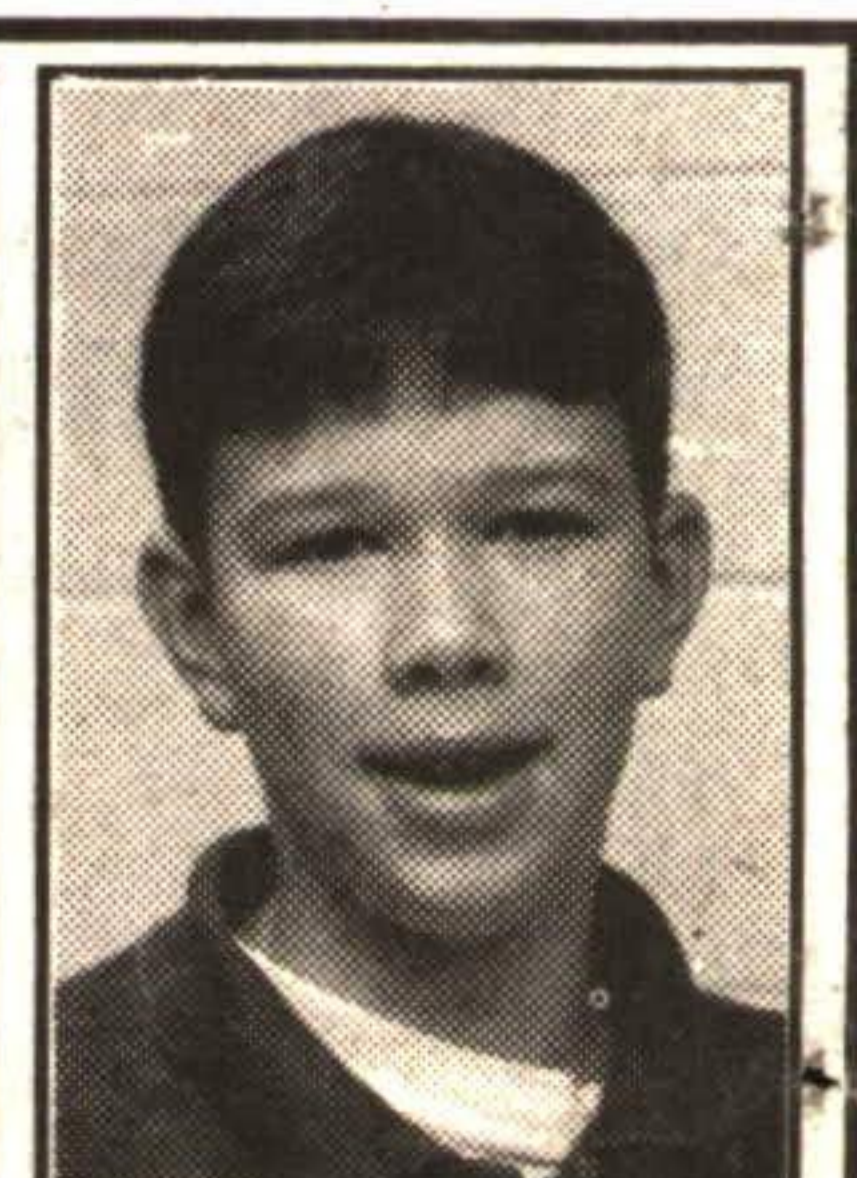
