School flag suggested as an 'Image of Racism'

Georgetown High School students learned this month that their school flag could be deemed a racist symbol.

More than 140 students attended a "Teach-In" on Images of Racism sponsored by the Open Door Youth Centre and North Halton Cultural Awareness Council, November 10.

One of the four speakers, Benjamin Radford, an Anti-Racism consultant with the Ontario Anti-Racism Secretariat, brought up the use of the Confederate flag as a symbol of Georgetown District High School. Radford gave a short history lesson on the American civil war and the use of blacks as slaves, noting that the Confederate flag was used by the American south during the war. When people see our flag, which represents school spirit to Georgetown, he said, they remem-

ber the painful images that the flag originally stood for.

"It's the same thing as a Jewish boy seeing a Nazi flag," noted Radford.

It was suggested that maybe some students should form a committee to change the school symbol.

Another speaker was former professional football player Richard Lewis. He is the executive director of Goals for Youth, an organization that promotes young people's futures through academics, personal development and community partnership.

Lewis spoke of incidents involv-

ing racism during his football career and delivered a short speech on setting goals without anything getting in your way.

Vivian Gonzalez is an university student working with Radford to alleviate racism in society. Gonzalez focussed her lecture on youth having the power to rid our country of racism.

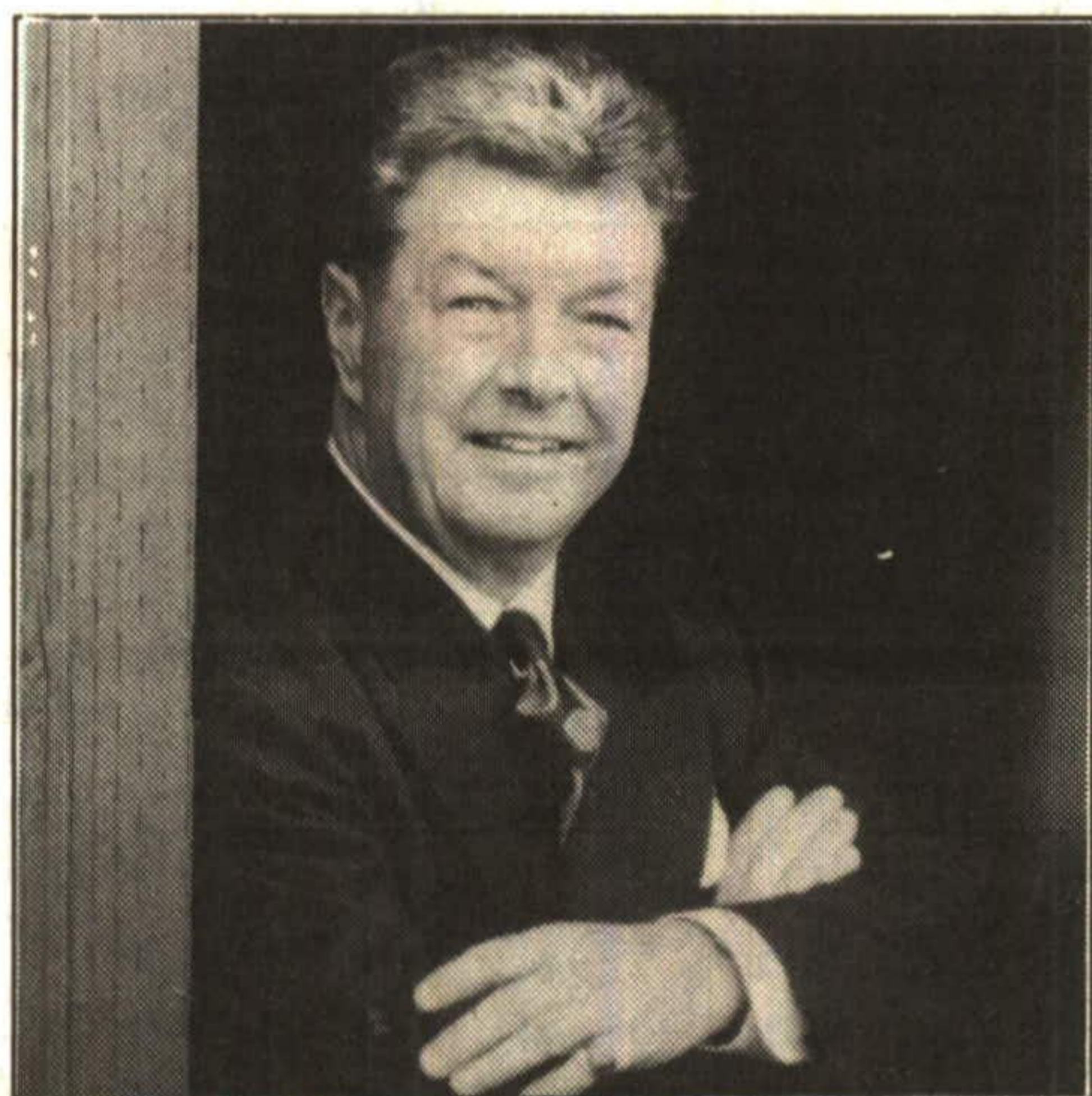
"Youth have a voice and a choice," Gonzalez told the group. Even young people have an influence in our society, she explained.

Jehd Canceran was the fourth speaker. Another university student, Canceran said he believes that everyone has the power to do what they want.

"Stick to your beliefs and follow your dreams," he told the students, "Don't let anyone or anything stand in your way."
