In an effort to shake things up and get his Junior A hockey club back on track, Raiders' GM Jules Russiani has added three new names to the team roster.



Ferusha is a strong skater who is particularly effective in the cor-


"All three of these new players bring a lot of experience and talent to the club, and should fit in nicely," explained Russiani.


Curling champs crowned


