Four-year-old is 'honorary firefighter'

Student earns special honor

"I'm happy, I'm happy," said four-year-old Cameron O'Rourke when he became an honorary firefighter for a day and got to go for a ride in a fire truck.

He also went home with an emergency services Tshirt and a framed award. His parents were at Cedarvale Park with a camera and video camera to record the special occasion.

The Maple Co-op Nursery School student was given the award for being an exceptional student in the Learn Not to Burn program. In fact, some people are sure the boy will become a firefighter when he grows up.

"If I was a betting man I'd put \$20 on it right now," said Fire Prevention Officer Brian Ellsworth. "He's an exceptional individual, he has a great grasp of fire prevention and is a leader of his group. He knows the answers and has enthusiasm for the program."

All 50 students at Maple Co-op Nursery School went through the 10 hours of instruction between September and December.

"They learn to drop and roll if their clothes catch on fire, what to do if the smoke alarm goes off, what to do if they find matches or hot things (tell an adult), how to get out of a home and not to be afraid of firefighters when they have their equipment on," Ellsworth said.

Learn Not to Burn has been in place in Halton for one or two years. It is available to children up to Grade 8, and the separate board will be introducing the program soon, but so far the public board hasn't taken up the instruction.

The program originated in the United States and teaches children 25 safety practices. Ellsworth said that the fire department found that children were coming to the Fire Hall and were very impressed with the large trucks, but weren't learning fire prevention. This program has them well versed in fire safety before they visit the hall, and is based on continually reinforcing and building on what they have learned so that by the time they get to Grade 8 they know a great deal about fire prevention.


