
The Raiders took on Brampton Friday and Streetsville Saturday night at home.

During a special press conference at Alcott Arena Wednesday evening, president Barry Trood officially announced his intentions to move his lacrosse club to Georgetown.


The hour-long presentation, which included an interesting look at the history of the game, was attended by members of the recreation and parks department, the local lacrosse leagues, members of town council and Halton Hills Mayor Marilyn Serjeantson.

Operating out of Bolton Community Centre, Trood and his Caledon Bandits showed significant improvement since joining the (Ontario Lacrosse O.L.A. Association) three years ago but failed to gain the support of the town.

Due to this poor financial situation, Trood has moved his club to Halton Hills, changed the name to the Georgetown Bulldogs and is ready to introduce some competitive junior level lacrosse to local

"We had been steadily improving, but the support in Caledon just wasn't there. There were a number of sites we considered moving the team to, and we chose Georgetown and Halton Hills for two reasons.

"First, because minor lacrosse has started up again in Georgetown and has a strong program in Acton as well. And second, Alcott Arena provides facilities that are more than suitable for the team. That is why we chose to come here," explained Trood, an Orangeville native.

Home games will be played Friday nights at Alcott, or the 'Dogpound' as it will be referred to during the summer months.


Admission will be around \$4 or \$5, comparative with the average cost of most junior hockey games.


