Dog licenses for 1995 are now on sale at \$15.00 each. By-law No. 94-077, as amended, requires that all dogs in Halton Hills must be licensed before February 15th of each year, or within seven (7) days of being acquired.

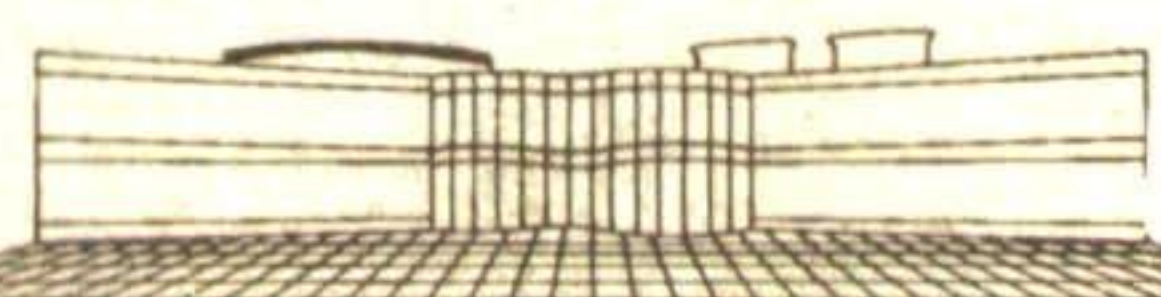
Dog licenses are \$20.00 per dog if purchased after February 15, 1995, not including any penalties or fines which may be imposed by the courts for conviction of an offence under the Animal Control By-law.

Arena-users petition to keep service

The town has been presented with a petition, signed by about 500 Acton Arena users, concerned about the elimination of the pro shop to accommodate a handicapped wash-room for Acton seniors.

As soon as possible the seniors will be using the hall at the Acton Arena as a temporary seniors centre. To make room for the wash-room the pro shop, which offers skate sharpening, was to be eliminated. The petition stated the arena users like the service provided by the shop and they do not want to see it removed from the arena.

Paul Stover, superintendent of facilities for the town, said a meeting has been set for Monday with Acton Minor Hockey Association to discuss the issue.

"I expect we will come up with a solution," said Stover. "There is a possibility the shop could be relocated to the lower level, but there would be cost involved."

He estimated it would likely cost more than \$2,000 to have the shop moved properly. He added the recreation department questions whether that expenditure is wise in light of the fact the arena will only be used until the new facility is built.

"We have an automatic skate sharpening machine in the arena," said Stover. He added tape and laces could be sold from the town's concession booth.
