Job funding will help 140 students

Ttudent job placements are on the rise at North Halton YMCA Youth and Community Services.

A month ago the Independent & Free Press reported that although there was provincial funding for subsidies for 140 student placements in north Halton, only a dozen students had been placed. Placements were being administered through the YMCA office in Georgetown Marketplace Mall.

Now 64 students have jobs said Philip Elliott, one of three people hired to make the placements. "(The placements are) going really well, it's improved immensely since we last spoke," he said.

The program offers employers a subsidy of \$2.50/hr to go toward the wages of students hired through the program.

A total of 217 students have been assessed, leaving 153 still waiting for a placement, he said.

"We stopped taking students in for assessments as of July 31," he said. "On Aug. 6 the last fulltime placement (had been) made so students can work a full four weeks and get the experience."

Students who will be kept on part-time into the fall will be placed up until August 31, he

While the funding was originally supposed to stop on Labor Day weekend, Elliott said there's an 80 per cent chance it will continue on into the fall.
