

Lots of changes ahead at the Georgetown Fair

The Georgetown Fair is trying several new things this year for their 150th anniversary on Sept. 6, 7, 8.

The Royal Canadian Mounted Police Musical Ride is coming to Georgetown and fair board members are expecting an especially large crowd.

Last year about 13,000 attended and this year they expect upwards of 20,000 people.

They have set up a hotline to give local residents information about the fair. By calling 877-7712

people can hear a recorded messages about fair dates and admission prices, musical ride information and information about general fair events.

Weekend passes can be purchased in advance at the Georgetown Cultural Centre box office and can be paid for by Visa. Weekend passes sell for \$12 with a service charge of \$1.25 if purchased in this way. Individual tickets can be purchased for \$5 Friday, or \$6 Saturday or Sunday with a service charge of 50 cents. There are

reduced rates for children 7 to 12 years and those under 6 are admitted for free.

"A big draw is the musical ride. You can see it in 101 places, but you can't meet the Mounties and see the horses close up. Usually it's pretty restricted," said secretary treasurer Austin Carpenter.

Arrangements for lots of parking and shuttle bus services are being made. Parking will be at Georgetown South park, Canadian Tire on Guelph St., Neilson Dairy and the Civic Centre.
