More calls to Crime Stoppers tip line

Trime Stoppers of Halton Inc reports a 36 per cent in the number of anonymous crime-solving tips received for the first six months of 1996 (when compared to statistics for the same period in 1995).

Ted Acheson, the chair of the board of directors for Crime Stoppers of Halton Inc., credits their decision to contract with Crime Stoppers International for after-hours call answering, as the main reason for the surge in calls.

"We knew people were trying to reach the office after hours, but we are pleasantly surprised by the volume."

These calls have helped police solve 23 cases so far this year. While the number of cases closed, and charges laid, has remained relatively constant, the value of recovered stolen property and seized narcotics has jumped from \$6,860 in 1995, to \$160,400 so far in 1996.

Rewards for successful tips have also increased to more than double the amount approved last year.

"The board is very pleased with the program's improved statistics. We provide a means for people to communicate crime-

solving information anonymously, and it is apparent from the numbers works," the program Acheson says.

Crime Stoppers, which is a volunteer-managed organization is hopeful the new common number of Crime Stoppers will further assist with solving crime.

The number, 1-800-222-TIPS, will automatically channels the callers to their local programs. Callers do not have to give their names, and any tip that leads to an arrest automatically qualifies the caller for a cash reward of between \$50 and \$1,000.


