## 'Stop project' Kingsmill-area residents plead

Two Kingsmill area residents pleaded with Halton Hills councillors to use their political weight and object to another Law Development Group project in their neighborhood.

Their case: a lack of recreational space in the area, alleged poor service record by the developer (residents have taken him to court), increased housing density and spoilage of a ravine view.

"The area needs more recreational space, not more homes and cars," said resident Mike Foley, representing the Housing Fairness Association, the local residents' homeowners association. He noted that crime was on the rise in the neighborhood and said, "Kingsmill children and young people need a place to hang out."

However councillors, Monday night, passed a recommendation on a zoning amendment and a plan for condominium of Phase III of Law Development. It's a 45-unit townhouse development at River Dr. and Maple Ave.

Since Law has already gone to the Ontario Municipal Board (OMB) for approval on the development, the town's actions are merely an advisement to the OMB and Halton Region, that it has no objections to the development. The town's "no objection" is conditional on fulfillment of a list of items including town acquisition of parkland, landscaping and site plan agreement requirements.

Councillors also approved the purchase of 1.74 acres of land from Law Development Group for parkland in the Kingsmill area — something the residents have been demanding. The agreement was concluded Thursday at the approximate price of \$247,000.
