This year's Christmas Bazaar at the community hall in Eden Mills took a green turn this year. As part of the town's efforts to become carbon neutral, the bazaar featured all the great things people come for every year - the penny table, the beautiful full-service tea in the basement - but this time around, things were definitely more local than ever. There were of course all the baked goods which have

this year saw the addition of teas, mincemeat and fruitcakes made with mostly locally sourced ingredients, local produce and honey, dog biscuits, granola, decorative greenery for the home, and a whole table devoted to local garden seeds that resident artist Charlotte Reinhold put together with lots of help from people in town. She created the drawings for each seed package, which ranged from vegetables to flowers to herbs.

Seed saving is part

to raise awareness and inspire people to become seed savers; it's a movement that aims to keep the costs down for growers, retain control of seed stock within smaller agricultural communities, and support plant diversity.

The money tree was there again, always popular, although the crisp vintage one and two-dollar bills were not up for grabs sadly.

Organizer Barb Marshall says the annual event has been going for years, long before her time as a lifelong resident. And as always business was booming.
