Rockwood man killed in crash

An 87-year-old was identified as the man killed in a Monday collision between a pickup truck and an e-bike.

Wellington County OPP identified Frank Wood of Rockwood as the deceased Tuesday afternoon.

Wood was riding the ebike on Wellington County Road 125, south of Wellington County Road 50 in Guelph-Eramosa Township— just north of Acton— at approximately 4:55 p.m. when his electric bike collided with a Dodge pickup truck.

Wood was pronounced dead at the scene.

The driver of the pickup truck was not injured.

The cause of the collision continues to be investigated by the Wellington County OPP and the West Region OPP Highway Safety Division.
